

FORTIETH DAY

Thursday, March 28, 2013

The Senate of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2013, convened at 11:34 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator English who was excused.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Ninth Day.

At this time, Senator Kidani introduced a group of students from Mililani High School and their teachers Danielle Castro, Claire Gearen, Lailanie Richmond, and Amy Perusso, Hawai'i's representative at the 2012 National History Teacher of the Year program. The students and teachers were visiting the Capitol to make observations for their classes in Government, Modern Hawaiian History, and Participation in Democracy.

Senator Wakai, on behalf of Senate President Kim and Senator Chun Oakland, introduced a group of 58 ninth-grade students from Farrington High School who were participating in Students Day at the Capitol with their teachers Steven Ing, Michelle Murray, Sean Doo, Thinh Vu, Leticia Mejia, and Debbie Pollock, and chaperone Sophie Wong. The students had participated in a mock hearing and testified on two bills and a resolution as a way to learn and understand the legislative process.

Senator Taniguchi recognized and congratulated Dr. Doris Ching and Dr. Amy Agbayani for their research for and publication of *Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in Higher Education Research and Perspectives on Identity, Leadership and Success*. Dr. Ching was accompanied by her spouse Wilbert Ching, brother-in-law Albert Chun, sister-in-law Priscilla Chun, nieces Kelly Chun and Lori Lum, nephews Glenn Ching and Tim Ho, sister Dorothy Nada, sister Helen Yanamura, and brother-in-law Ken Yanamura. Dr. Agbayani was accompanied by her partner Gus Gustafson, and sisters Lina Agbayani and Aleli Starosta. Senator Taniguchi also recognized additional colleagues and friends of Dr. Ching and Dr. Agbayani who were seated in the gallery.

Senator Solomon extended her congratulations to Dr. Ching and Dr. Agbayani and noted that she had the privilege of working with both of these outstanding and dedicated educators. Senator Solomon also shared how inspirational she found their book to be in highlighting the tremendous role Hawai'i has played in furthering the education of Pacific Islanders.

Senator Baker also extended her congratulations and mahalo nui to Dr. Ching and Dr. Agbayani for their continued assistance to neighbor island students, particularly those from the Filipino communities on Maui and Lāna'i, in transitioning to University of Hawai'i at Mānoa and with work opportunities and tuition waivers.

The Chair noted that Dr. Agbayani hailed from Kalihi Valley, as did the students present in the gallery from Farrington High School.

At 11:45 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
