Chair Gabbard, Vice-Chair Ruderman and Members of the Committee

My name is Paul Chang. I wish to be a member of the Environmental Council because I want to use my experiences as a member of various Boards and Commissions, as well as a carpenter to the Council. I believe that working my way up from an apprentice to my current position of Service Representative will bring another point of view to the table. I've worked side by side in the field with other carpenters as well as different tradesmen. I've also worked with employers, business leaders and government officials. This has taught me to be a listener, and that there are many sides to a story.

I believe my purpose, as a member of the Council, would be to approve of disapprove an EIA after a comprehensive review. This I believe I can do because of the experiences that I've stated above.

What I hope to accomplish as a member would be to familiarize myself with what the Council has done in the past. I would look at the issues, both positive and negative, and then endeavor to see where improvements could be implemented.

Qualities that I believe I can bring to the table are 1.) Trustworthy 2.) Fair 3.) I can laugh at myself. I know that everyone's story is important to them. I believe I can explain to most people that the answer sometimes is no and explain why.

### An example of this is:

A member felt that he was wrongfully terminated. The situation wasn't black and white. The circumstances that the employer presented that were damaging to our case. After weeks of talks and a joint board hearing we were able to come to a settlement. No got what they wanted, but both parties did come to an agreement. I felt my ability to listen, do the research and understand the rule/laws I can be a benefit to the Council.
