My name is Ruthann Quitiquit and I have been the President & CEO of Parents And Children Together (PACT) for over 20 years. Historically I have served on a number of Governor appointed boards and councils and thus have a fairly good understanding of the demands required and personality needed to successfully serve in this capacity. When the request came for PACT to consider nominating one of our employees to sit on the Early Learning Advisory Board (ELAB), I immediately asked Ben Naki to apply.

Ben Naki is the Program Director of PACT's Early Head Start and Head Start Program. Mr. Naki has worked at PACT for over 13 years, first as a Father Facilitator, then numerous positions within Early Head Start and Head Start and now as the very seasoned Early Head Start and Head Start Program Director. Mr. Naki's position presents him with a wealth of knowledge about early childhood education.
