In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 775 SUBMITTING FOR CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE COMMISSION ON WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, MILTON D. PAVAO, FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-17

The Department of Land and Natural Resources supports the Governor's nomination of Mr. Milton Pavao to serve on the Commission on Water Resource Management ("Water Commission") (Governor's Message 775).

Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) §174C-7(d) provides that an independent nominating committee composed of two (2) members selected by the Governor, one (1) by the Senate President, and one (1) by the House Speaker) solicits applications by public notices published in newspapers statewide, in the Water Commission's monthly bulletin, and on the Water Commission's website. The Nominating Committee reviews applications and sends the names of at least three qualified individuals for each opening to the Governor for consideration.

HRS §174C-7(b) provides that the members must have "substantial experience in the area of water resource management." In addition, one member must "have substantial experience or expertise in traditional Hawaiian water resource management techniques and in traditional Hawaiian riparian usage such as those preserved by" HRS §174C-101.

Following this nominating process, the Governor selected Mr. Milton D. Pavao.

Mr. Pavao worked for the County of Hawaii Department of Water Supply ("Hawaii DWS") for thirty-nine and a half years. Mr. Pavao was the Manager-Chief Engineer for 17 years prior to his retirement in 2011.

Under Mr. Pavao's leadership, the Hawaii DWS consistently delivered safe, clean, potable water at a reasonable cost to its customers through 24 water systems island-wide. The immense size of the island, the relative isolation of many of the communities, and development pressures in Kona presented special challenges. To address Kona water issues, Mr. Pavao co-founded the Kona Water Roundtable – a forum for federal, state, county, and private hydrologists and consultants to discuss and actively plan for Kona's water issues.

Mr. Pavao is a licensed professional engineer and is a member of the American Water Works Association. In 1999, he received the Distinguished Service Award and Engineer of the Year Award from the Hawaii Society of Professional Engineers.

Mr. Pavao's background in municipal water supply management and his experience and technical knowledge of water-related issues will be of great value to the Commission. The Department supports Mr. Milton D. Pavao's nomination and appointment to the Commission on Water Resource Management.

Working directly with him as his subordinate for five years, Mr. Pavao introduced me to a broad and extensive network of professionals working in the drinking water industry, intra/inter-governmental agencies, and private consulting associates on local, state, and national levels. Mr. Pavao cultivated all of these connections through dedication and hard work to intelligently stay ahead of the curve and projections for water demand for the island of Hawai'i. I have always found him to be: open in the discussion of differing points of view; a quick study of new ideas, including new hydro-geologic findings such as in North Kona; fair and even-tempered in dealing with everyone; and, most importantly, willing to make decisions on difficult and contentious issues. HDWS has always been, by a large margin, the easiest of the State's municipal water departments to deal with. Milton deserves most of the credit for this.

Milton is retired now, meaning that he is both able and willing to put in the time necessary to study the issues that come before the Water Commission and to provide guidance to the Commission staff in preparing their analysis and recommendations on these issues. I have been before the Commission on numerous occasions since its inception. That perspective allows me to say that Milton's personnel skills, professional background, fairness, and decisiveness present a rare opportunity in a nominee to the Water Commission. I urge you to take advantage of it.
