RELATING TO A STATE CAPITOL GIFT SHOP

Chair Nishimoto and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to testify on H.B. 1122.

The Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) does not support passage

of H.B. 1122 for the following reasons:

- DAGS does not have the resources or expertise needed to procure and manage commercial retail activities for this purpose;
- 2. The anticipated benefit of generating revenues for the State from the operations of the gift shop may be overly optimistic, when considering the loss in use of the space for valuable office purposes, and the associated cost to the State to perform lease administration over the gift shop operation;

- 3. There currently are no vacant spaces within the State Capitol Building which could be considered for this purpose; and
- 4. Commercial activities within the State Capitol Building or on the State Capitol grounds may adversely impact historic considerations; the State's general obligation bond rating; and State laws, such as Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to the management and disposition of public lands.
