## RE: Comments on HB 131, Relating to Mobility Management

Catholic Charities Hawai'i (CCH) is a tax exempt, non-profit agency that has been providing transportation services for elders since 1975 and annually provides transportation services for nearly 800 older persons on the island of Oahu. The agency serves approximately 5,000 older persons with in-home and community based serves and is also a Medicaid waiver provider of services for individuals with developmental disabilities.

CCH would like to offer the following comments on HB 131:

- 1. The bill appears to focus on transportation needs of elders and individuals with disabilities only in <u>rural</u> communities. However, mobility management issues affect elders and individuals with disabilities in all communities, including urban areas. We recommend that any task force review the needs of elders and individuals with disabilities <u>statewide</u>.
- 2. Task force membership We recommend additional representation form the following sectors in order to assure that recommendations result from collaborative effort:
  - a. Private transportation providers, both profit and nonprofit
  - b. Transportation consumers elders and individuals with disabilities
  - c. State Department of Transportation
