Re: H.B. 1342, Relating to Debt Collection

The Department of Taxation (Department) appreciates the intent of H.B. 1342, and provides the following information and comments for your consideration.

H.B. 1342 requires the Department of the Attorney General (AG) to collect accounts which are delinquent for more than ninety days for executive departments, other than the Department of Taxation, University of Hawaii (UH), and Judiciary, and places an unspecified per cent of moneys recovered on these accounts for deposit into a newly-established fund. It also allows the Department, the UH, and the Judiciary to contract with a collection agency to collect on delinquent accounts. The measure would take effect on July 1, 2013.

The Department defers to the AG on the merits of this measure, however, the Department notes that it already has authority under section 231-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to retain bonded collection agencies, licensed attorneys, accountants, auditors or other persons for the purposes of assessment, enforcement, or collection of taxes.
