My name is Dayton M. Nakanelua and I am the State Director of the United Public Workers, AFSCME, Local 646, AFL-CIO (UPW). The UPW is the exclusive representative for approximately 14,000 public employees, which include blue collar, non-supervisory employees in Bargaining Unit 1 and institutional, health and correctional employees in Bargaining Unit 10, in the State of Hawaii and various counties. The UPW also represents about 1,500 members of the private sector.

The UPW opposes HB1588 HD1, which amends the civil service exemption for personal service contracts for custodial and grounds maintenance services with qualified community rehabilitation programs to last no more than one year and at a cost of \$850,000 per contract.

This measure seeks to replace positions and jobs traditionally fulfilled by public civil service employees. Changing Act 191, SLH 207 by increasing the cap to \$850,000 per contract promotes privatization and may create legal problems as it contradicts the findings in *Konno vs. County of Hawaii*.

Dear Senators:

In your letter of February 10, 2014, you asked for clarification regarding whether the \$850,000 limit in section 76-77 (16), Hawaii Revised Statutes is on a per contract basis. We answer in the affirmative. It is the opinion of the Department of the Attorney General that the \$850,000 limit prescribed in the above-referenced statute is a <u>per contract</u>, not aggregate, limit in the exemption from the civil service laws for personal service contracts for building, custodial, and grounds maintenance services with qualified community rehabilitation programs. We have found nothing in the legislative history that contradicts this conclusion and we agree that a plain reading of the statute supports this conclusion.

Because it appears that there is some confusion about the meaning of this provision, we would support the passage of either SB 2744 or HB 1588 to bring further clarity to this issue.

My name is Megan Jorgensen. I'm a junior in the School of Social Work at the University of Hawaii and I was born and raised on Maui. I'm writing in support of House Bill 1588 that would amend Hawaii Revised Statutes Section 76-77 to confirm that the exemption from the civil service laws contained in subsection 16 of that statute for personal service, custodial, and grounds maintenance contracts between the County of Maui and qualified community rehabilitation programs, such as Ka Lima O Maui, is for a maximum of \$850,000 per contract, and not \$850,000 total for all of their contracts

Ka Lima O Maui's mission is to "Enhance Lives through Self-Reliance" for persons with disabilities through employment related programs. The contracts that Ka Lima O Maui currently has with the County of Maui for ground maintenance and custodial services total \$1.2 million and employ over 50 persons with disabilities. Because of the contracts with the County of Maui and the programs that Ka Lima O Maui runs, disabled persons on Maui who are often overlooked and who wouldn't otherwise be able to work are given assessments, training and employment on Maui. As a result, they can feel proud that they are contributing to the community and they can have self-respect and some level of independence in their lives.

If this amendment to the statute is not made, I understand there is an argument being made that the maximum amount of \$850,000 should be for the total amount of contracts that Ka Lima O Maui has with the County of Maui each year. However, I've been told that the organization already had \$1 million in contracts with the County of Maui when the current law was adopted in 2008 and it would not have made sense for the maximum amount to have been set at a number that made those contracts improper at that time.

Ka Lima O Maui provides a great service to people of Maui and especially to those who are disabled and are most in need.
