Subject: H.B. 1664 Relating to Fire Protection for Fireworks

I am Manuel P. Neves, Chair of the Hawaii State Fire Council (SFC) and Fire Chief of the Honolulu Fire Department (HFD). The SFC and the HFD support H.B. 1664, which proposes to restrict storage and redistribution of fireworks to permanent and temporary fireworks storage facilities that comply with county building, fire code, or nationally recognized standards. We respectfully request the following revision:

- "<u>\$132D- Storage and redistribution of fireworks.</u> A person shall only store or perform redistribution activities of fireworks in a permanent or temporary fireworks storage buildings or structure, which shall comply with the applicable county building code, fire code, or the latest edition of nationally recognized standards."
- <u>\$132D-8</u> Application for license. (c) Permanent and temporary fireworks storage buildings or structures and buildings or facilities where redistribution activities are performed shall comply with the currently adopted county building or fire code or the latest edition of nationally recognized standards."

Since fireworks redistribution activities are conducted and completed within a few days, the buildings where such activities are conducted will have safety requirements, but will not have to meet the requirements for a permanent or temporary fireworks storage building. This revision will be consistent with the language of S.B. 2302, which is proceeding through the senate committees.

In addition to fireworks being a potentially dangerous product during its use, dangers also exist during transport and storage. The definitions being proposed are based on nationally recognized standards for safety and best industry practices to protect lives and property that will be applicable statewide.

Redistribution involves unpacking, segregating, and repacking fireworks shipments, which are then shipped to the neighbor islands or transported to retail locations.

This revision would include requirements from the building or fire codes or other nationally recognized standards that apply to redistribution activities, which are currently not included in Chapter 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The SFC and the HFD urge your committee's passage of H.B. 1664 with the recommended revision.
