In consideration of HOUSE BILL 1769 MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO MANAGE ALBIZIA TREES ON THE ISLAND OF HAWAII

House Bill 1769 proposes to appropriate funds to the University of Hawaii for the control of albizia (*Falcataria moluccana*) on Hawaii Island. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) **supports this measure and offers the following comments.**

As an island state, Hawaii faces a broad array of invasive species problems, including stinging fire ants, rapidly growing invasive plants that alter watershed forest composition and function, marine algae that smother our coral reefs, and mosquitoes that may carry deadly diseases. The fast-growing albizia tree is one of these problems, in that it can displace native plant species and present a human health risk by dropping branches onto roadways or other structures. The interagency Hawai'i Invasive Species Council (HISC), administratively hosted within the Department, is currently funding a demonstration project on albizia control methodologies in Puna on Hawaii Island.

Albizia control is a worthy effort in Hawaii, especially strategic control in areas such as Puna and roadways leading to the Hilo Medical Center. Because albizia is one of many serious invasive species impacting Hawaii, the Department suggests that an appropriation for the control of albizia be considered within the context of other budgetary requests for invasive species control in Hawaii under consideration during this legislative session. As written, this bill would provide as much as \$5,000,000 from the general fund to the University of Hawai'i for control efforts. The Department supports this effort, in so much as this appropriation does not negatively impact appropriations for other priority invasive species projects across the State.

The Oahu Invasive Species Committee supports HB 1769, which would provide funding to control and manage albizia tress along state highways and near emergency facilities with a focus in the Puna district on Hawaii Island.

Alibiza poses significant harm to native ecosystems and the public health. Hazardous trees, those that are a risk to human safety, adjacent to public infrastructure or private homes, may cost up to an estimated \$10,000 per tree to control. This legislation will provide essential funding that will prevent potential disasters by controlling of these highly invasive trees, which may be brought down on roads, hospitals or homes during either a major storm event or due to age related self pruning events.
