Chair Rhoads and Committee Members:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Bill No. 1797, H. D. 2. This Bill would require the Department of Education (DOE) to provide seniors at each public high school with voter registration information prior to graduation. The Bill would also require the Department of Human Services (DHS) to provide young adults in the Young Adult Voluntary Foster Care Program (YAVFCP) with information on voter registration. Finally, the Bill authorizes the DOE and DHS to assist students and young adults in the YAVFCP with voter registration.

Though we have no position on this Bill, we support its intent and offer the following comments.

Firstly, voter registration information and related services must be delivered uniformly statewide to help establish an informed electorate comprised of individuals from a wide array of socio-economic backgrounds.

Additionally, we believe an appropriation to the DOE and DHS is necessary so they do not have to divert funds from other programs to provide the required services.

Testimony in Support of HB 1797 HD 2 Relating to Voting

Hawaii Youth Services Network (HYSN), a statewide coalition of youth-serving organizations, supports HB 1797 HD 2 Relating to Voting.

Hawaii has one of the lowest voter turnout rates in the country. In the past few elections, only about 40% of the state's registered voters have participated in the primary election. And that's only about 36% of all the people in Hawaii who are eligible to vote, registered or not. We do better in the general election, but turnout has still been in the 50 percent range in non-presidential years and a bit above 60 percent in presidential election year.

Providing high school students and youth in foster care with encouragement and assistance with voter registration, in settings where they feel comfortable, will help young people form the habit of voting and increase their participation in the election process.
