#### HB 1888, RELATING TO FISH LABELING

**Testimony of Gary L. Gill Acting Director of Health**

1 **Department's Position:** We respectfully oppose the bill's amendment of HRS Chapter 328.

2 Fiscal Implications: The creation of the special fund would require additional time and effort to

3 manage and track for a purpose that the department does not support.

4 **Purpose and Justification:** The bill amends HRS Chapter 328 by introducing new language levying

5 fines for the misbranding of fish and fish products that have caused illness, and that these fines would be

6 deposited into a special fund to cover costs associated with implementation of this measure.

We appreciate the concern that some consumers have become ill after eating fish or fish products that may have been misbranded. However, we believe the proposed changes to HRS Chapter 328 are unnecessary because HRS Section 328-10 already addresses the proper labeling of food products, and HRS Section 328-30 also provides administrative penalties up to \$10,000 for each separate offense. Unfortunately due to competing priorities, such as addressing foodborne illness risk factors and

- 3 We believe continued efforts to address misbranding violations derived through routine
- 4 inspections and/or by consumer complaints, and through education of industry and the public, make this
- 5 measure unnecessary.
