Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Har, and Committee members:

I'm Ron Han, Director of the State Office of Veterans Services (OVS). I appreciate this opportunity to provide testimony **in support** of the concepts in House Bill 1907, HD1, (HSCR 515-14) along with some recommendations.

Thank you for introducing this measure to allow disabled Veterans who were honorably discharged and State residents, and those who received wounds in combat earning the Award of the Purple Heart Medal, to pay only \$3 for a hunting license.

**Here are some recommendations**: That the bill be further modified for all those who are qualified disabled Veterans with a service connected disability defined by the Veterans Administration of 10% or higher. Would also recommend that the phrase "the loss of use of a lower extremity" be also stricken from the bill, as this would create a significant amount of workload for Veterans Affairs. Not only would they have to research the applicant's disability rating, but also dig deeper into records to ascertain whether or not the disability rated was the loss of the use of their lower extremities. A Veteran who has a 10% disability can have a significant difficulty with physical and/or mental mobility.

Giving back to those who have served valiantly in uniform in support and in sacrifice to our country is truly a great privilege. The freedoms we enjoy today have been paved by their dedicated and honored service.

We defer to the agency with direct responsibility for implementation.

The OVS supports the concepts and intent expressed in this measure as long as its implementation does not impact or replace the priorities set forth in the Executive Budget for Fiscal Year 2015.

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony on behalf of Hawaii's Veterans and their families in support of HB 1907, HSCR 13-14.
