### In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2127, HOUSE DRAFT 1 RELATING TO THE PUBLIC-PRIVATE FINANCE INITIATIVE

House Bill 2127, House Draft 1, proposes to establish the Public-Private Finance Initiative ("PPFI") to implement a pilot project on the management of government facilities in Wahiawa, Oahu. The Department of Land and Natural Resources ("Department") opposes the bill to the extent it seeks an exemption from Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and offers the following comments.

The purpose of House Bill 2127, House Draft 1 is to promote the maintenance of government facilities through public-private partnerships. The bill creates the PPFI and designates a pilot project for it on four parcels of State land in Wahiawa. Three of these parcels (Tax Map Keys: (1) 7-4004:071, 7-4-004:001 and 7-4-006:012) are under executive order to the Department of Accounting and General Services ("DAGS") for the Wahiawa Civic Center, and the fourth parcel (Tax Map Key: (1) 7-4-004:070) is under executive order to the Department of Education, Hawaii State Public Library System ("HSPLS"), for the Wahiawa Public Library.

At the present time, DAGS and HSPLS have the use of the lands and facilities without payment of rent. Under the bill, the PPFI would have authority to enter into lease agreements of the DAGS and HSPLS facilities in Wahiawa with private partners who would manage and maintain the facilities in exchange for rent payments from the government. Such agreements would be subject to the prior approval of the boards and executives of both DAGS and HSPLS. The bill further provides any such management agreements or leases would not be subject to Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), relating to public lands.

Section 171-11, HRS, governs lands set aside to an agency by executive order. Generally, an agency needs to seek the prior approval of the Board of Land and Natural Resources ("BLNR")

for any lease or other agreement encumbering the land that is longer than 14 days in duration. Obtaining prior BLNR approval for the kinds of management or lease agreements proposed by the bill would not appear to be an onerous burden. Chapter 171, HRS, is indicative of the public policy that public land leases shall be reviewed and approved by the BLNR in order to provide the public fair and open opportunities to acquire a lease of public lands. Accordingly, the Department opposes the bill to the extent it seeks an exemption from Chapter 171, HRS.
