Road closures, accidents, and landslides often increase this commute time significantly. The establishment of a West Maui hospital will ensure access to treatment until safe transport can be guaranteed for critical patients.
- 3. The Maui Island Plan calls for "the immediate development of a critical access hospital in West Maui" and describes "the need for long-term care beds" in the region as "particularly acute."

For the foregoing reasons, I support this measure.
