MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING COST ITEMS

This measure is a vehicle bill to appropriate and authorize funds for collective bargaining cost items for salary adjustments, other cost adjustments, and Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefit Trust costs for public employees represented by the Hawaii Government Employees Association (HGEA) belonging to Bargaining Unit 9 (registered nurses) and their excluded counterparts for Fiscal Biennium 2013-15.

Although the collective bargaining process for this bargaining unit has not yet concluded, the Department of Budget and Finance supports moving this measure, or similar ones, as HGEA and the public employers have reached a tentative agreement concerning Unit 9. The ratification vote is expected to be complete by February 27, 2014. If this agreement is ratified, we will be submitting a proposed revised draft of this bill with appropriation amounts inserted consistent with that agreement.
