1 Department's Position: The Department supports H.B. 2304 relating to the Neurotrauma Advisory

2 Board.

3 **Fiscal Implications:** There are no fiscal implications.

**Purpose and Justification:** H.B. 2304 proposes to amend HRS §321-3 to change the minimum 4 5 number of members on the Neurotrauma Advisory Board (NTAB) from 21 to 11 members as appointed by the Director of Health. The smaller number of members will allow the board to have 6 quorum on a regular basis improve the effectiveness of its statewide advisory board's capacity to 7 assist the Department to meet its legislative charge. More importantly, a total of three (3) survivors 8 or family members of individuals with neurotrauma will be appointed to the Board by the Director 9 and will have the highest number of representatives as compared to the other groups. This measure 10 proposes to delete representation from the Spinal Cord Injury Association as this association is no 11 longer in operation. A spinal cord injury survivor or family member will continue to be represented 12 on the NTAB. The Department has discussed this measure with the Board and they are in support of 13 reducing the number of board members. Lastly, this measure will allow the Director to appoint up to 14

1 three state and county ex officio non-voting members to the NTAB. Partnerships and collaboration

2 with such entities will provide a more coordinated effort for NTAB initiatives.
