Project, a non-profit organization committed towards providing free medical care for the homeless and medically underserved of Oahu. As an individual, I strongly support H.B. No. 2430, H.D. 1, Relating To Health, which would appropriate funds to provide primary medical, dental and behavioral healthcare to the uninsured and underinsured.

As a part of the Hawai'i H.O.M.E. Project, I have seen many individuals facing socioeconomic as well as medical hardships.
