TESTIMONY ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2583
RELATING TO ASSISTING UNLICENSED CONTRACTORS

TO THE HONORABLE ANGUS L.K. MCKELVEY, CHAIR, AND TO THE HONORABLE DEREK S.K. KAWAKAMI, VICE CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department") appreciates the opportunity to testify on House Bill No. 2583, Relating to Assisting Unlicensed Contractors. My name is Daria Loy-Goto, Complaints and Enforcement Officer for the Department's Regulated Industries Complaints Office ("RICO").

RICO offers the following testimony in support of the bill.

House Bill No. 2583 amends §444-9.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") to provide that a contractor licensee who aids and abets an unlicensed contractor may

be subject to further discipline by the Contractors License Board ("Board"). The bill proposes the same amendments as House Bill No. 2274, the Department's Administration bill.

Currently, aiding and abetting an unlicensed person is a misdemeanor and the Board, in recent decisions, has indicated that enforcement of the existing law is outside the scope of administrative proceedings. As a result, RICO is limited in its ability to pursue administrative action against licensees who aid and abet unlicensed contractors.

Although RICO has also relied on §444-17(17), HRS, to administratively prosecute aiding and abetting conduct, this provision only applies to situations where a licensee enters into a contract with an unlicensed contractor. Because aiding and abetting conduct often occurs without a written or oral contract, RICO is foreclosed from prosecuting such conduct in a majority of circumstances. House Bill No. 2583 will enable RICO to pursue, and authorize the Board to take, disciplinary action against contractor licensees who aid and abet unlicensed contractors.
