- 1 Department's Position: Comments on Part II only.
- 2 **Fiscal Implications:** Up to \$25,000 in operational costs for Part II only.

3 Purpose and Justification: The Senate Draft 1 added Part II to HB398 HD1 to establish a task force to

4 address transitional issues of certain health care programs as they prepare to transfer from the

5 Department of Human Services to the Department of Health on July 1, 2014.

7 Act 93, SLH 2012 transfers DHS programs relating to home and community-based case management,

8 community care foster family homes, and adult day care to DOH, and since enactment the agencies have

9 regularly met to resolve transitional issues and keep the provider network informed. Because of this

10 progress, DOH recommends deferring Part II pending clarification of the following:

11 •	Scope -	- HB398	SD1	includes	providers	already	regulated	by	DOH	previous	to Act	: 93,	SLH
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12 2012 such as adult residential care homes while others specified in the same Act such as adult

13 foster homes are excluded. The mix of business models, federal, state, and county regulations,

1	• Intent – DOH and DHS have established rule-making authority to regulate home and
2	community-based facilities that requires a public hearing process per Chapter 91. As a matter of
3	practice, DOH does and will consult with providers and client advocates to assure the right
4	balance of interests.
5	• It should be noted that there are no client or patient representatives on the task force.
6	o Neighbor Island representation is also not specified, and likely discouraged due to lack of
7	reimbursement for expenses or an appropriation.
8	• Technical – We believe the intent of the Section 3, subsection (a)(4) is to include "Caregivers of
9	persons with developmental or intellectual disabilities," as opposed to "Developmental and
10	intellectually disabled caregivers;" as currently drafted.
11	
12	In the event that this Committee wishes to act on HB398 SD1, we respectfully request deletion of Part II
13	in favor of a resolution clarifying the scope, intent, and technical issues discussed above and one which
14	"allows" or "encourages" the department to meet with key leadership of stakeholders who are caregivers
15	or facility operators to define the key issues and focus attention on those issues. An appropriation
16	amount is requested if Part II remains in the bill to support the complex implementation of the task
17	force.

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of H.B. 398, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, is to: Part I - require child care facilities, family child care homes, group child care centers, group child care homes, and infant and toddler child care centers that care for children less than one year of age to develop, maintain, and implement safe sleep policies as adopted by the Department of Human Services, to prevent sudden unexpected infant deaths and sudden infant death syndrome; Part II – establish a task force to address the issues of home and community-based facilities during the transition of services from the Department of Human Services to the Department of Health (DOH).

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) supports the intent of Part I of this bill which seeks to prevent the tragic deaths associated with sudden unexpected infant deaths and sudden infant death syndrome.

The DHS respectfully requests a further amendment to this bill as follows:

"<u>All child care facilities, which include family child care homes, group child care</u> <u>centers, and group child care homes, as those terms are defined in section 346-151, and</u> <u>infant and toddler child care centers, that are registered or licensed by the department to</u> <u>provide care for children one year of age or younger shall [develop, maintain, and</u> <u>implement] implement and maintain a written safe sleep policy in accordance with **any** <u>rules adopted by the department. The purpose of the safe sleep policy shall be to</u> <u>maintain a safe sleep environment that prevents the occurrence of sudden infant death</u> <u>syndrome and sudden unexpected infant deaths in children one year of age or younger.</u>"</u>

The DHS fully supports this amending language which will allow the DHS to accommodate any changes to best practice and standards of care by rules. This is critical as the body of knowledge related to sleep related deaths continues to grow as researchers continue to seek answers to sudden unexplained infant deaths.

The DHS has grave concerns regarding Part II of this bill which was added in the S.D. 1 of this bill. The DHS is concerned that the addition of Part II may affect the passage of H.B. 398 which is an important measure originally intended to further ensure the health and safety of children through a safe sleep policy for licensed child care providers.

The DHS also offers the following comments regarding Part II of this bill "for a task force to address issues facing home and community-based facilities during the transition from the DHS to the DOH." Act 93, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, transfers from the DHS to the DOH, only the home and community-based case management, community care foster family homes; and the adult day care programs. Adult residential care homes, adult foster homes and developmental and intellectually disabled caregivers are already part of the DOH and were not affected by the transfer. The DHS and the DOH have been working collaboratively to effectuate a seamless transfer of the Act 93

programs and have engaged the community in issues relating to the transfer. We respectfully recommend that in lieu of a task force, the DHS and DOH be encouraged to continue the dialogue with the community and the providers.

Chair Baker, Vice Chair Galuteria, Members of the Committee:

I am writing to express support for HB398, which would require child care providers to develop, maintain and implement safe sleep policies for infants.

For over 70 years, the March of Dimes has been a leader in maternal and child health. Our mission is to *improve the health of women of childbearing age, infants, and children by preventing birth defects, premature birth, and infant mortality.* March of Dimes is in the midst of a long-term Prematurity Campaign to increase public awareness of the problems of prematurity and to decrease the rate of premature birth worldwide

Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) is the leading cause of death in babies between one month and one year old, and is most common among babies between two and four months old. Premature babies are at increased risk for SIDS. A study published in the January 2013 *Journal of Perinatology* found that extremely premature infants had a significantly higher risk of dying from SIDS than full term infants.

The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) reports that one in five SIDS deaths occurs while an infant is in the care of someone other than a parent. Many of these deaths happen when babies who are accustomed to sleeping on their backs at home are placed on their tummies for sleep by another caregiver. At the March of Dimes NICU Family Support Program at Kapiolani Medical Center for Women & Children, we provide families with infants in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit the AAP's *Parent's Guide to Safe Sleep* that emphasizes "Tummy to Play and Back to Sleep." The guide also recommends that parents talk to their baby's caregivers about reducing the risk of SIDS through safe sleep.

House Bill 398 would ensure that all registered or licensed child care providers would have the policies in place to maintain safe sleep environments for infants in Hawaii. March of Dimes urges the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection to pass HB 398.
