Re: H.B. 503 Relating to General Excise Tax

The Department appreciates the intent of H.B. 503 and provides the following information and comments for your consideration.

H.B. 503 creates a general excise tax exemption for amounts received by farmers for the sale of fresh farm produce intended to be consumed in Hawaii. The exemption applies to gross income received after December 31, 2013.

The Department suggests that the language on page 1, line 5, of the bill that says "This chapter shall not apply to amounts" be replaced with "There shall be exempted from, and excluded from the measure of, the taxes imposed by this chapter, all of the gross proceeds" for the purpose of statutory and administrative consistency.

In addition, this bill raises a possible constitutional issue. Due to the potential for discriminatory impact on sellers of produce sourced from outside Hawaii, there is a possibility that the exemption runs afoul of United States Supreme Court commerce clause jurisprudence. The Department defers to the Department of the Attorney General for further comments as to constitutionality.
