BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 291C-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$291C-4[+] Safe routes to school program special fund;
4 establishment. (a) There is established in the state treasury
5 the safe routes to school program special fund, into which shall
6 be deposited:

- 7 (1) Assessments collected for speeding in a school zone,
 8 pursuant to section 291C-104; and
- 9 (2) Safe routes to school program surcharges collected in
 10 accordance with sections 291-16 and 291C-5.

11 Moneys in the fund shall be distributed by the director of 12 transportation to the respective counties to expend. <u>Moneys on</u> 13 <u>balance in the special fund at the close of each fiscal year</u> 14 <u>shall remain in that fund and shall not lapse to the credit of</u> 15 the general fund.

(b) The director of transportation shall adopt rules
pursuant to chapter 91 to implement this section. The rules

House Bill No. 591 amends Section 291C-4, HRS, to provide that moneys from the Safe Routes to School Program special fund will not lapse to the general fund at the close of each fiscal year.

The Department of Budget and Finance would like to point out that the proposed amendment to Section 291C-4 is unnecessary. In general, special fund moneys do not lapse to the general fund unless specifically required by statute. In this case, there is no such requirement so the special fund moneys would remain in the fund at the end of the fiscal year.
