Comments: I strongly support HB632, Relating to Open Data. This measure requires executive departments, boards, commissions, and agencies to make data available to the public. Absolves the State for liability for deficiencies or incomplete data. And requires the CIO to enact rules to address making data sets available to the public. We believe that this bill is the cornerstone to increasing transparency in government, will drive civic engagement, and will create the infrastructure needed to support the software development industry.
