

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 279E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$279E-3 Metropolitan Planning Organization membership.
- 4 The MPO shall consist of a policy committee and appropriate
- 5 staff. The MPO policy committee shall consist of [thirteen]
- 6 fourteen members. These members shall include:
- 7 (1) Five members of the legislative body of the appropriate county;
- 9 (2) Three members of the state senate:
- 10 (A) One of whom shall be chairperson of the senate
  11 committee with primary responsibility for
  12 transportation issues. In the event there is
- more than one chairperson of the senate committee
- with primary responsibility for transportation
- issues, the senate president shall identify the
- 16 chairperson who shall serve on the MPO policy
- 17 committee and who shall not be required to be a
- 18 resident of the appropriate county; and

## HB 689 RELATING TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF A METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION

House Committee on Transportation

The DOT supports H.B. 689 with additional comments to amend the bill.

This bill will amend the composition of the board of all Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) within the state as required by Public Law 112-142, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21). If an MPO were formed on the neighbor islands, this bill would require that the executive director of the Honolulu Area Rapid Transit be a member of any such Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), which we believe is not the intended purpose of the bill.

To appropriately address the need for this new member on any MPOs the following change is strongly recommended on page 2.

"6. One member who shall be the director of the authority for rapid/mass transportation, or successor agency thereof that operates public transportation on that island."

### Testimony in Support of HB689

### House Committee on Transportation February 20, 2013

The Oahu Metropolitan Planning Organization (OahuMPO) is charged with executing a Continuous, Comprehensive, and Coordinated (3-C) transportation planning process for the island of Oahu (23 CFR 450.300). The proper execution of that 3-C process is an important part of the eligibility of local transportation projects for Federal funding. The US Department of Transportation Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration can withhold up to 20-percent of Federal funding if they believe the intent of the 3-C process is not being fulfilled. OahuMPO's designated planning area includes all of the island of Oahu, as approved by the Governor on October 29, 1992.

In July 2012, President Obama signed into law a new Federal surface transportation authorization act, *Moving Ahead for Progress in the Twenty-First Century* (MAP-21, P.L. 141-112). One of the new provisions of MAP-21 is the following:

"...each metropolitan planning organization that serves an area designated as a transportation management area shall consist of...officials of public agencies that administer or operate major modes of transportation in the metropolitan area, including representation by providers of public transportation..."

A transportation management area is defined as an urban area with a population of 200,000 or more (23 U.S.C. 134 and 23 CFR 450.300). OahuMPO is Federally recognized as serving a transportation management area.

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) was created after voters approved a City Charter amendment in November of 2010. It is a semi-autonomous agency responsible for constructing and operating the single largest public transportation project on Oahu.

It seems quite clear that in order for OahuMPO to properly execute a Comprehensive and Coordinated transportation planning process on Oahu, HART must be part of that process. In fact, MAP-21 appears to require HART representation within the MPO. Failure to include HART within the MPO may jeopardize Federal certification of OahuMPO and the Federal transportation funding upon which so many transportation projects depend.

Therefore, I strongly support HB689 and encourage its approval by the House.

I was present at the original meeting when the current HART Executive Director appeared before the HART Board for a vote to hire him for a three year contract. I think he makes an excellent partner for the Mayor and the DTS Director. However, I wish to make a suggestion: the language of the change calls for a 14 member Committee. I would like to see a 15 member "odd" numbered committee to assure that decisions are not "hung" due to a tie. The Senate membership because it is a smaller chamber is smaller at 3, while the House is at 5 members. Without changing the title of the Measure, recommenda that Board membership language be amended to make it a 15 member committee with additional representation from the Senate...making it 4 instead of the current three.
