RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION

House Bill No. 714 establishes a Veterans Services Special Fund into which shall be deposited the funds from donations received through motor vehicle certificate of registration, appropriations made by the Legislature, and gifts, donations and grants. The funds are to be used to provide up-to-date information to veterans, under Section 363-3, HRS.

The department does not support the creation of special funds which do not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3, HRS. Special or revolving funds should: 1) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and charges made upon the users or beneficiaries of the program; 2) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 3) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. In regards to House Bill No. 714, the proposed special fund does not appear to comply with Section 37-52.3.
