My name is Lucy Lessard, I am a physical therapist and the Manager of Inpatient Rehabilitation Services at The Queen's Medical Center. I would like to provide testimony in support of HB 844, Relating to Physical Therapy.

The Queen's Medical Center is the leading medical referral center in the Pacific Basin and offers a comprehensive range of primary and specialized care services, including acute care physical therapy, occupational therapy and speech language therapy. As the only Level II Trauma Center and only The Joint Commission-certified Primary Stroke Center and Hip and Knee Joint Replacement Center in the State of Hawaii, we specialize in the care of complex trauma, stroke and orthopedics patients.

The Queen's Medical Center employs a large number of physical therapists throughout our acute care and skilled nursing units. They provide a necessary service to our patients and are valuable members of the multidisciplinary team. However, Hawaii is one of only three states that do not have statutory language which authorized the state board of physical therapy to require some form of continued competence for licensees. This means that there is no regulation which ensures that physical therapists maintain current, relevant, and competent while working as physical therapists. The physical therapy profession continues to evolve and change and newer, better and more efficient treatment options continue to be developed. At The Queen's Medical Center, we strive to be the leading edge of health care in the state, and ensuring continued physical therapy competence and education will support our goal.

Comments: I'm against licenser of occupations - why would a physical therapist need to be licensed? Milton Friedman was against licenses as they give control of occupations to the state and diminish the free market. "No licensure of physicians," because that would help to "reduce and eliminate the monopoly power of the American Medical Association. That monopoly power is derived almost entirely from the fact that the practice of medicine is an activity which can be engaged in by only those who have licenses from government. And the control over that licensure procedure is what has enabled the AMA to exercise its monopoly power for these many decades." Milton Friedman.
