The Hawaii State Coalition Against Domestic Violence writes in support of HB895. The Hawai`i State Coalition Against Domestic Violence is a statewide coalition of domestic violence service providers, our mission is to engage communities and organizations to end domestic violence through education, advocacy, and action for social justice.

HB895 raises the marriage license fee and increases deposits to the spouse and child abuse special account established under section 346-7.5; the spouse and child abuse special account established under section 601-3.6; and to the domestic violence and sexual assault special fund established under section 321-1.3. These special funds support the maintenance and enhancement of critical domestic violence, child abuse, and sexual assault intervention programs within the Department of Human Services, the Judiciary, and Department of Health.

Furthermore, these special funds support local organizations working to prevent sexual assault, domestic violence and child abuse and neglect in Hawai'i. It is estimated that for every \$1 spent on violence and abuse prevention, \$9 is saved on intervention and treatment services. While crisis intervention is a necessary response to domestic violence, it alone cannot address the complex dynamics of this social problem.

We respectfully request that the committee pass HB895.
