1 **Department's Position:** The Department of Health opposes this measure.

2 Fiscal Implications: Uncertain.

3 **Purpose and Justification:** HB988, HD2, SD1 proposes to include a provision for support of

operations of an environmental disaster standby and response facility that would be responsible for the 4 recovery and rehabilitation of native wildlife due to oil or fuel-related disasters. While the department 5 6 appreciates the intent of this measure, we believe that this intent coupled with possible funding and the 7 establishment of a separate special fund may reduce the flexibility of response programs to carry out their statutory responsibilities. Furthermore, the department is concerned that this measure may be 8 9 conflict with the Administration proposals (HB857/SB1088) and other legislative proposals that seeks to 10 reallocate the Environmental Response, Energy, and Food Security Tax ("barrel tax"). The proposed 11 reallocation will significantly strengthen Hawaii's environmental response, energy and food security 12 responsibilities. The Department defers to the Department of Agriculture (AG), the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism (DBEDT), Department of Taxation (TAX), and Budget 13 14 and Finance (B&F) to determine more specific impacts of the their respective potential revenues and the 15 administration this provision. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this important measure.
