In consideration of HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 128, HOUSE DRAFT 1 URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE NATIONAL OCEANIC AND ATMOSPHERIC ADMINISTRATION TO MAKE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC AN ANNUAL REPORT ON THE STATE'S ENDANGERED MARINE ANIMALS

House Concurrent Resolution 128, House Draft 1 requests the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration ("NOAA") to produce annual reports of the State's endangered marine life, to provide those reports to the Department of Land and Natural Resources ("DLNR") and for DLNR to post those reports on its website. **DLNR supports the intent of** this resolution. However, much of the information requested is already available to the public.

Within NOAA, the National Marine Fisheries Service ("NMFS"), Protected Resources Division ("PRD"), reviews marine mammal stock assessment reports ("SARs") annually for all stocks of marine mammals in United States waters. When substantive new information is available on stock parameters (such as abundance, estimated annual mortality, fecundity, etc.), the assessments are updated. SARs are produced for all marine mammals under the Marine Mammal Protection Act ("MMPA"). Many of these marine mammals are not listed under the Endangered Species Act.

When marine mammals are listed, their status becomes "strategic" in the SAR. Potentially, this number could be removed from the population without having negative impacts on population health may become lower. The annual SARs contain the best information NOAA has about population sizes, trends, causes of mortality, and other life history parameters of marine mammals. One of the purposes of the SARs is to inform the public about the stock information and regulations that apply to these animals.

The SARs are limited to mainly biological information. Therefore, information about regulations and other efforts to conserve and minimize human interactions are not generally contained in the SARs (although they may be referenced in SARs). The public may obtain a broader range of information (including a breakdown by animals in the Pacific region) at the PRD website at <a href="www.nmfs.noaa.gov/pr/sars/region.htm">www.nmfs.noaa.gov/pr/sars/region.htm</a>.

While DLNR could provide a link to the website, the additional obligation to post, maintain, and update these reports on DLNR's website imposes long term costs and duplicates information already available.

We strongly urge the House to revise the Concurrent Resolution to state that DLNR provide a link on the DLNR website to the SAR reports
