1 Department's Position: Comments.

2 Fiscal Implications: The services requested by this resolution cannot be supported by the existing

3 budget of DOH Office of Health Status Monitoring (OHSM). An additional \$1,000,000 is required.

4 Purpose and Justification: The Department of Health's goal is to issue all the vital records in our

5 custody in a timely and accurate manner, particularly those with Hawaiian diacritical marks.

7 DOH appreciates fund previously appropriated by the legislature to modernize and electronically capture

8 vital records and migrate away from a paper-based system. However, accommodating Hawaiian

9 diacritical marks was not technologically feasible at the time, and thus was not a high priority

10 requirement.

12 Although modern IT systems can now easily accommodate diacritical marks, tens of thousands of vital 13 records have been added to the system since the modernization project in the 1980s. Significant 14 investment beyond OHSM's annual budget appropriation is required.

Promoting Lifelong Health and Wellness

- 1 The initiative has two major components, requiring an estimated \$1,000,000 investment in DOH
- 2 infrastructure to complete:

- 1) Document Hawaiian names correctly for new vital records going forward, and
- 5 2) Retroactively correct existing records within the electronic system and verify against paper-
- 6 based records.

8 This could be accomplished either through amending Hawaii Revised Statute to permit DOH to increase
9 fees for vital records transactions or through supplemental budget appropriations.

Access to DOH records is critical to Native Hawaiians because these records are needed to verify ancestry for certain programs offered by the OHA, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, Kana'iolowalu and Kamehameha Schools. Having these DOH records issued in a timely manner with the accurate spelling of Hawaiian names speaks to fairness and justice and will further the perpetuation of the host culture of Hawai'i.
