In consideration of HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 228 REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE EXISTENCE OF SANDALWOOD ON THE MAJOR HAWAIIAN ISLANDS.

House Concurrent Resolution 228 requests the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to conduct studies related to sandalwood for each of the major Hawaiian Islands. **The Department supports the concept of this resolution and offers the following comments**:

Information pertaining to harvested sandalwood that is sold internationally or shipped out of state is available through the United States Department of Agriculture Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, and the Department has reviewed this information as far back as 2010. Any harvesting of sandalwood in the Conservation District zone is regulated through the Department's Office of Conservation and Coastal Lands.

The only commercial harvest of sandalwood occurring in the State are located in the South Kona area of Hawaii Island, and the Department has visited and is familiar with both operations. The Department believes that sustainable commercial harvest of sandalwood has the potential to encourage investment in restoration and management of these highly valuable trees.

The Department agrees that an inventory and distribution survey of Hawaiian sandalwood, especially those on Hawaii Island, is needed to determine the impact of current harvest and extent of restoration that may be needed. There are several methods that can be used to conduct these kinds of surveys and the Department feels the best and most inexpensive method involves high resolution remote sensing. The estimate to conduct such surveys on Hawaii Island is approximately \$1,000,000.

The Department appreciates the opportunity to support this resolution should adequate funds be made available.
