HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII BOARD OF REGENTS TO STUDY THE REINTEGRATION OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHANCELLOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT MANOA WITH THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII SYSTEM.

1 WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Constitution guarantees that the 2 Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii has exclusive 3 jurisdiction over the internal structure, management, and 4 operation of the University of Hawaii, subject only to the 5 exclusive jurisdiction of the Legislature to identify and enact 6 laws of statewide concern; and

8 WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Constitution also specifies that
9 the Board of Regents shall appoint the President of the
10 University of Hawaii to serve as its executive officer; and

12 WHEREAS, in 2001, the University of Hawaii was reorganized 13 so that the University of Hawaii System and the University of 14 Hawaii-Manoa are no longer led by the same executive officer; 15 and

WHEREAS, in 2001, the Board of Regents reorganized the organizational structure of the University System with the understanding that establishing the Office of the Chancellor of the University of Hawaii-Manoa would incur no additional administrative costs to the University System; and

WHEREAS, in 2011, the Office of the Chancellor of the
University of Hawaii-Manoa required an annual operational budget
of \$14.7 million; and

WHEREAS, in 2011, it was also estimated that there had beenover \$6.4 million in additional administrative costs at the

1 University of Hawaii-Manoa since the establishment of the Office of the Chancellor of the University of Hawaii-Manoa; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, even after the former Chancellor of the University of Hawaii-Manoa stepped down at the end of the 2011-2012 school 5 year, and the current Chancellor of the University of Hawaii-6 Manoa assumed his position in June 2012, debate continues as to 7 whether or not it is necessary for the University of Hawaii to 8 9 maintain the Office of Chancellor for its Manoa Campus; now, therefore, 10 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 13 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the Board of 14 Regents of the University of Hawaii is respectfully requested to 15 study whether the reintegration of the Office of the Chancellor 16 of the University of Hawaii-Manoa with the Office of the 17 President of the University of Hawaii System is prudent; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Regents is requested to report its findings and recommendations to the 21 Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the 22 Regular Session of 2014; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the Board 26 of Regents of the University of Hawaii, Chancellor of the 27 University of Hawaii-Manoa, and President of the University of 28 Hawaii System. 29 30 31 32 OFFERED BY:

HCR 39/HR 21 – REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII BOARD OF REGENTS TO STUDY THE REINTEGRATION OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHANCELLOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT MANOA WITH THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII SYSTEM.

Chair Choy, Vice Chair Ichiyama, and members of the committee:

The University of Hawai'i has concerns with HCR 39/HR 21, which asks for a study on the reintegration of the Office of the Chancellor of the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa with the Office of the President of the University of Hawai'i System.

As HCR 39/HR 21 correctly notes, the Board of Regents is responsible for the internal structure, management, and operation of the University. The Board of Regents, through its Advisory Task Group, is currently engaged in a detailed review and assessment of the Board and the University System. The Board of Regents also considered the roles of the President and UH Mānoa Chancellor during the recruitment and hiring of the current Chancellor. Action by the Legislature in this area is not needed. Moreover, while the proposed Resolutions appropriately recognize the role of the Board of Regents, the University is concerned that such action could be viewed as contributing to an environment that has caused concerns to be expressed by the University's accrediting body, the Western Association of Schools & Colleges, in its recent action letter to UH.

The University of Hawaii Professional Assembly (UHPA) supports undertaking a full assessment of the appropriate administrative structure that can best serve the needs of the University of Hawaii and the position that the University of Hawaii at Manoa (UH Manoa) holds as a research institution. Over the past few years duplication of programs and services have been hastened by decentralization and autonomy of each respective campus. One of the consequences has been tension in the exercise of authority and decision making between the University of Hawaii President and UH Manoa Chancellor over control of programs and resource allocation. UHPA believes this tension must be resolved for the health of UH Manoa and its continuing role as a robust research institution.

UHPA urges the Committee to support this resolution.
