The Special Education Advisory Council (SEAC), Hawaii's State Advisory Panel under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), is in **strong support** of HCR 57 and HR 43.

Representatives from SEAC have been working over the last two years with the Department of Education and representatives from diverse family and community organizations to address the concerns raised in SCR 145 (2011) and SCR 79 (2012). Since the Department of Education's latest report to the Legislature in December 2012 on SCR 79 efforts, there has been no clear plan to accomplish the remaining tasks outlined by the Department and seconded by the participating family and community organizations. These efforts are needed to build the capacity of public schools to engage routinely in family school partnership practices.

SEAC firmly believes that another resolution is needed to maintain the momentum of the group and realize our shared goals, so that ultimately, student achievement is positively impacted.

This testimony is in support of HCR57 relating to Family-School Partnerships.

The Hui for Excellence in Education (HE'E) is a diverse coalition of over 40 parent and community organizations dedicated to improving student achievement by increasing family and community engagement and partnerships in our schools. Our member list is attached.

For the last two sessions, the legislature passed SCR145 and SCR79, respectively, which requested that the DOE, with input from community organizations, to establish, implement, and monitor statewide policies for family engagement in Hawaii's public schools. HE'E along with other organizations worked with the DOE staff to refine policy for family-school partnerships and make recommendations on the implementation of the revised policy. Those recommendations were highlighted in a report to the legislature in 2013.

On behalf of Family Voices of Hawai'i, I offer testimony in support of HCR57, which seeks to continue the work between the Department of Education (DOE) and family and community organizations to finalized guidelines for family-school partnerships. As an organization, Family Voices is national grass roots organization of family of friends of child with special health care needs. In Hawai'i, we operate the federally funded Hilopa'a Family to Family Health Information Center and are the Medicaid Ombudsman.

A hallmark of the last year has been the collaborative effort between the DOE and family/communication organizations in developing draft policy statement the "Family-School Partnership Policy". This work is not complete and it would benefit our larger school community if the partners involved were able to complete the tasks to finalize the policy and see the effort completed through its adoption by the Board of Education and the development of corollary operational guidelines.
