1 **EOA's Position:** The Executive Office on Aging (EOA) supports this measure.

2 **Purpose and Justification:** Identified in the 2009 report, "Respite Care in the State of Hawaii,"

3 the current respite system is fragmented and flooded with several barriers, such as prohibitive

4 costs associated with service delivery and virtually no transportation to or from respite sites,

5 limiting service use among Hawaii's caregivers. Knowing that these barriers are limiting the use

6 of respite services in Hawaii, EOA is exploring alternative forms of currency to support respite

7 service delivery, namely, the concept of timebanking.

Biscussed in greater detail in this measure, timebanking offers a unique opportunity for Hawaii to leverage our community's natural assets to help meet the needs of our community as a whole. To support the continued investigation into the feasibility of a timebanking system to strengthen and increase Hawaii's respite capacity, EOA was recently awarded two AmeriCorps VISTA members. VISTA members will be assisting us in conducting a theoretical analysis and

| 1 | feasibility study, and this document will guide EOA as we consider a timebank demonstration |
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| 2 | project to increase our State's respite capacity. To further strengthen our efforts, we have |
| 3 | identified several key national stakeholders, many of whom have implemented similar models in |
| 4 | their communities, and these key stakeholders will provide further guidance to EOA as we plan |
| 5 | this demonstration project. |
