In consideration of HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 80 REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON ACTIONS TAKEN IN RESPONSE TO THE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN THE AUDITOR'S REPORT NOS. 01-09 AND 06-04.

House Concurrent Resolution 80 requests that the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) submit a report to the Legislature on the actions it has taken to address the findings and recommendations contained in the Legislative Auditor's reports. **The Department does not object to this resolution**.

The Department notes that it does undergo a financial audit annually by a certified public accountant and has a financial and management audit conducted every five years by the Legislative Auditor. The Department has addressed the findings and recommendations in the audits. The Department further notes that the deficiencies in the boating facilities were exasperated by the lack of Capital Improvement Project (CIP) funding. This created a situation where the Department's Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation did not have the financial resources to address the structural deficiencies in the harbors.
