TESTIMONY ON HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 199 AND HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 160, URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS AND THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION FOR MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY: HAWAII DIVISION, TO DEVELOP DRAFT LEGISLATION ESTABLISHING, IMPLEMENTING, AND MONITORING CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL LICENSED MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPISTS IN HAWAII.

TO THE HONORABLE ANGUS L.K. MCKELVEY, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Lynn Bhanot, and I am the Executive Officer of the Marriage and Family Therapists Program ("Program"), Professional and Vocational Licensing Division ("PVLD") of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. Thank you for the opportunity to present testimony on House Concurrent Resolution No. 199 and House Resolution No. 160.

The Program appreciates the efforts of the Legislature to allow the two (2) agencies to work collaboratively to develop draft legislation establishing, implementing, and monitoring continuing education requirements for all licensed marriage and family therapists in Hawaii. The Program would like to urge the Committees to include a provision that the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy: Hawaii Division, shall complete the PVLD's Continuing Professional Education Guidelines Checklist ("Checklist"). The completion of the checklist will assist with (1) demonstration of a need to impose such a requirement, (2) identification of the objective(s) that mandatory continuing education is meant to address, (3) a review of existing mechanisms or methods and a finding that mandatory continuing education is the best method to achieve the objective(s) identified in (2) above; (4) verification that continuing education courses meeting the objective(s) are readily available and accessible to the person; (5) evidence that the fiscal impact on the professional will not be adverse; and (6) confirmation that resources are available for the regulatory agency to implement the continuing education program.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on House Concurrent Resolution No. 199 and House Resolution No. 160.
