# **REQUESTING A FINANCIAL REPORT FROM THE AHA MOKU ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

House Resolution 179 requests a financial report from the Aha Moku Advisory Committee (AMAC) covering fiscal years 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 that itemizes all sources of funding, including general funds and interdepartmental transfers; expenditures made, including both amounts and purposes; projected expenditures; and, operational costs.

Under Act 288, the Committee is mandated to provide advice on the following:

- 1) Integrating indigenous resource management practices with western practices in each moku;
- 2) Identifying a comprehensive set of indigenous practices for natural resource management;
- 3) Fostering the understanding and practical use of native Hawaiian knowledge, methodology, and expertise;
- 4) Sustaining the State's marine, land, cultural, agricultural, and natural resources;
- 5) Providing community education and fostering cultural awareness on the benefits of the aha moku system;
- 6) Fostering protection and conservation of the State's natural resources; and,
- 7) Developing an administrative structure that oversees the aha moku system.

The Aha Moku System is inclusive of eight main Hawaiian Islands and forty-three (43) traditional moku districts. To fulfill the mandates of Act 288, the Committee has begun the organization of the aha moku system for each of the main Hawaiian Islands with the limited funding appropriated. We welcome the opportunity to give a realistic financial report to the Legislature as well as projected expenditures.

We are in support of this measure.
