HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TASK FORCE TO EXAMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF FORMING A UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT HILO MEN'S VOLLEYBALL TEAM.

WHEREAS, volleyball is one of the most popular sports in 1 2 the State; and 3 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii at Hilo women's 4 volleyball team is a source of pride to the Hilo community, 5 winning the Pacific West Conference Championships in the 2010, 6 2009, and 2007 seasons; and 7 8 WHEREAS, individual members of the University of Hawaii at 9 10 Hilo women's volleyball program have been recognized as national player of the year, conference player of the year, members of 11 the conference first-team, and conference coach of the year; and 12 13 WHEREAS, six men's and seven women's athletic teams 14 represent the University of Hawaii at Hilo at the National 15 Collegiate Athletic Association Division II level; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii at Hilo is not 18 represented by a men's volleyball team; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, local schools have produced outstanding volleyball players who may not have the athletic attributes to play at the 22 National Collegiate Athletic Association Division I level but 23 who could certainly develop and thrive at the Division II level; 24 and 25 26 WHEREAS, local male volleyball players who might not be 27 able to secure an athletic scholarship at the University of 28 Hawaii at Hilo even if a volleyball program is established would 29 still be more likely to enroll in college if the prospect of 30 31 walking on to the volleyball team was available; and 32

1 WHEREAS, every year that passes without a men's volleyball program at the University of Hawaii at Hilo denies some of these 2 young men an opportunity to pursue not just athletic, but 3 concomitant educational opportunities and development; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, a University of Hawaii at Hilo men's volleyball 7 team has the potential to be a source of pride for the University of Hawaii at Hilo, the Hilo community, and the State; 8 now, therefore, 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 11 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 12 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the University of 13 14 Hawaii at Hilo Director of Intercollegiate Athletics is requested to establish a University of Hawaii at Hilo men's 15 volleyball task force to study the feasibility of establishing a 16 University of Hawaii at Hilo men's volleyball team; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Intercollegiate Athletics is requested to invite the initial members of the task 20 force to participate, including at least one member from each of 21 22 the following: 23 The Chancellor of the University of Hawaii at Hilo or (1)24 the Chancellor's designee; 25 26 27 (2)The Director of the County of Hawaii Department of Research and Development or the Director's designee; 28 29 One volleyball community advocate to be appointed by (3) 30 the Chair of the House of Representatives Committee on 31 Higher Education; 32 33 (4) One volleyball community advocate to be appointed by 34 35 the Chair of the Senate Committee on Education; and 36 (5) One member of the travel industry to be invited by the 37 Director of Intercollegiate Athletics; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the task force 40 are requested to serve without compensation; and 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Hawaii at 43 Hilo men's volleyball task force is requested to submit a report 44 HCR LRB 13-0097.doc

HCR48/HR30 REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TASK FORCE TO EXAMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF FORMING A UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I AT HILO MEN'S VOLLEYBALL TEAM

Chair Choy, Vice Chair Ichiyama and Members of the Committee:

The University of Hawai'i at Hilo supports the intent of HCR48/HR30 to establish a task force to examine the feasibility of forming a UH Hilo Men's Volleyball Team. Our Office of Intercollegiate Athletics provides sound educational and athletic opportunities for the students of Hawai'i and beyond. As a campus, we are uniquely positioned to offer additional opportunities for students and their families to participate in collegiate athletics. Men's volleyball has strong sport offerings for high school students in the State of Hawai'i. The University of Hawai'i at Hilo already has a strong NCAA Division II women's volleyball program, in a competitive 14-member conference. The addition of men's volleyball would not only provide educational and athletic opportunities for young men in the state, but also enhance and grow our relationship with the community.

This program offers significant educational opportunities for students and would significantly strengthen our ties with our community and our state. Additional funding resources would be necessary to develop a high quality men's volleyball program.

We support the intent of HCR48/HR30. Aloha.

Aloha, Every Supporter for an NCAA Division II Mens Volleyball Program at UHHilo:

I'm certain that you are aware that in terms of **winning records and national recognition**, perhaps the most successful sports program in the history of UH Hilo Athletics has been the **women's volleyball program**.

This is largely because the NAIA and NCAA Division II competition allowed us to **recruit locally** to establish the program, and then **nationally** and even **internationally** to perpetuate it.

But the key to the success and support of the program has always been substantial local interest in competitive volleyball.

While UH Hilo has to a certain extent capitalized on that success, the University has failed to follow through with the logical extension of that success; that is, to establish a <u>Men's</u> Division II Volleyball program. The imperative to do so now should not be ignored.

We cannot dismiss the relationship between recognized athletic and academic competence at the university level; the more courses of study offered, the greater likelihood of increasing and sustaining student enrollment.

Similarly, increased opportunity for athletic participation not only appeals to the student athletes themselves, but to the larger student body. With few exceptions, students appreciate being part of a nationally recognized program, if only as fans and spectators.

And obviously, the appeal to Alumni (especially those who contribute to the financial support of the athletics component) cannot be overlooked.

But the real imperative for establishing such a program is the University's responsibility to the larger community. Each year, we see an increased interest in boys high school volleyball competition, not only on this island, but statewide.

Our local schools have produced outstanding players who may not be ready or proficient enough for NCAA I competition, but who could certainly thrive and develop at the **Division II** level.

And it is not just a matter of physical competence, more often it's a matter of simple economics.

Our local boys who might not be able to secure an athletic scholarship for volleyball at UH Hilo would still be more likely to enroll if the prospects of participating, even as a walk on, were available.

Every year that passes without such a program denies some of these young men an opportunity to pursue not just athletic, but concomitant academic development.

We implore you to support this initiative.

I have attached our Petition in Support of Men's Division II Volleyball at UH Hilo, and if you feel as strongly as we do, would you please make copies of the attached Petition and **actively seek Signatures and Addresses** for our combined efforts.

My name is Christopher Leonard and I am testifying in support of HCR 48 and HR 30 "Requesting the establishment of a task force to examine the feasibility of forming a University of Hawaii at Hilo Men's Volleyball team." I have been coaching boy's and girl's High School and top-level boy's and girl's club volleyball teams for the past 16 years. We have produced some fantastic student athletes on Hawai'i Island and across the entire state of Hawai'i. Many of these kids have gone on to play collegiate volleyball at programs around the country. Some of them have left Hawai'i to play at top collegiate programs in the country, but many who would rather stay home, have left to play at small schools around the country because there wasn't an opportunity to stay at home. Worse yet, many didn't go on to college at all because of the lack of opportunities available to them.

A men's volleyball program will provide opportunities for Hawai'i kids. It will encourage local kids to stay home and enroll in the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. It will also encourage out-of-state students (paying out of state tuition) to pursue opportunities at UHH. The program would receive wide-spread support in the community including support from the Moku O Keawe Region of USA Volleyball. Volleyball is less-expensive to run than many other collegiate athletic programs and would be very popular in the community providing for ticket revenue opportunities not seen by many other sports.

I believe the time is now to consider Men's Volleyball and provide more opportunities for our kids. I strongly encourage you to take the first step by forming a task force to further examine the feasibility of a program at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo.
