In consideration of HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 87/HOUSE RESOLUTION 62 REQUESTING THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE AND CHAIR A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP THE MEANS TO ALLOW PUBLIC ACCESS TO THE HAIKU STAIRS AREA

House Concurrent Resolution 87/House Resolution 62 requests that the Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources convene and chair a working group to develop the means to allow public access to the Haiku Stairs area. **The Department of Land and Natural Resources** (Department) supports these resolutions and offers the following comments.

The Ha'ikū Stairs is an exceptional recreational, historical, and educational resource, much cherished among the thousands of O'ahu's citizens who appreciate our natural splendor, value outdoor activities and respect the history of the island. Because of the aforementioned, the City and County expended over \$800,000 of public money on its restoration.

Haiku Stairs is an excellent exit or entrance point to Department's expert hiking trails in Moanalua Forest Reserve and has tremendous interpretative potential to safely observe a native windward cliff ecosystem as one ascends or descends the Stairs,

There may be practical public ways to access Haiku Stairs without going into or through the Haiku Valley community, eliminating concerns of trespassing on private property or disturbing local residents.

The Department recommends amending the resolutions' title from "CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD AND NATURAL RESOURCES CONVENE AND CHAIR..." to read "CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD AND NATURAL RESOURCES, OR THE CHAIRPERSON'S DESIGNEE, CONVENE AND CHAIR..."
