RELATING TO KAPOLEI RECREATIONAL SPORTS COMPLEX

Chair Dela Cruz and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to testify on S.B. 1002.

The Department of Accounting and General Services strongly supports S.B. 1002, an administration-sponsored measure.

S.B. 1002 is a "housekeeping" measure that repeals the submittal of an annual special fund report and other related provisions providing for the maintenance, operation, management, and promotion of the Kapolei recreational sports complex from the Stadium Authority's statutory framework. Since the land originally identified for the sports complex was transferred to the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) in 2006, and DHHL has, in turn, negotiated a lease with a development firm to construct a mixed use regional shopping center that is

scheduled to break ground in 2013, the statutory provisions requiring the Stadium Authority to submit an annual special fund report and maintain, operate, manage, and promote the sports complex are obsolete.
