Chair Ige and Members of the Committee:

### **DESCRIPTION:**

This measure amends Section 269-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), and Act 177, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, ("Act 177") relating to staffing and recruitment by the Public Utilities Commission ("Commission").

#### **POSITION:**

The Commission strongly supports this measure, as it is critical to the Commission's efforts to build its capacity to fulfill its rapidly changing regulatory duties. The Commission offers the following comments for the Committee's consideration.

#### COMMENTS:

This bill would provide the Commission with needed flexibility to recruit and hire staff with the right skill sets to effectively carryout the Commission's regulatory duties, particularly in the area of energy regulation. While the 2007 Legislature passed Act 177 authorizing the reorganization of the Commission, Act 177 mandates specific position descriptions for Commission staff based on the Commission's needs during that period, which makes recruitment of personnel to satisfy the Commission's efforts to identify key positions and rewrite position descriptions to build up staffing required to carry out its many current and future duties by eliminating the restrictions of Act 177. The Commission appreciates the amendments made by the Senate Committees on Commerce & Consumer Protection and Judiciary & Labor, which will provide greater flexibility in the Commission's recruitment and hiring activities.

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After being assigned additional space within the Kekuanaoa Building in July 2012, the Commission has continued to work on its office expansion and renovation plan with the assistance of the Department of Accounting and General Services, the Department of Budget and Finance, and the Office of the Attorney General. As the Commission's office expansion plan moves forward, S.B. No. 1042, S.D. 1 will serve to support the Commission in designing and filling the kinds of positions needed to modernize and transform the agency to meet the needs of a rapidly changing regulatory environment.

This measure proposes to insert new position titles within existing statutes describing the civil service status of Public Utilities Commission ("PUC") staff and repeals existing position staff descriptions for the Commission under Act 177, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007.

#### POSITION:

The Division of Consumer Advocacy strongly supports S.B. No. 1042, SD1.

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### COMMENTS:

S.B. No. 1042, SD1 allows greater flexibility to the PUC to hire professional staff. The PUC's staff plays an important role in moving and concluding all public utility dockets, including those relating to the State of Hawaii's energy future.
