SUBJECT: S.B. 1237 - RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES

PURPOSE: The purpose of the bill is to continue the Nursing Facility Sustainability Program by extending the sunset date, updating referral dates in the statute, revising the funding amount for FY2013-2014; and makes an appropriation.

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) respectfully opposes this measure because it would effectively extend the nursing facility sustainability program only through December 31, 2013, and it fails to address the appropriation language omitted from last year's Act that required an emergency appropriation for the current fiscal year.

The DHS strongly supports extension of the nursing facility sustainability program and necessary amendments proposed in the Administration bill, S.B. 1111. The DHS, the Healthcare Association of Hawaii, and the Hawaii Long-Term Care Association worked collaboratively to draft language agreed upon by all and included in S.B.1111. The DHS supports the nursing facilities and believes that continuing the nursing facility sustainability program is important. The DHS respectfully requests that the Legislature support S.B.1111 developed through the collaboration of the DHS, the Healthcare Association of Hawaii, and the Hawaii Long-Term Care Association.
