- 1 Department's Position: We support this bill provided that its passage does not replace or adversely
- 2 impact priorities indicated in our Executive Budget.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: Appropriates 1.5 million dollars in FY2014 and FY2015 for pre-hospital
- 4 emergency medical services 24 hours a day at Ewa Beach on Oahu.
- 5 **Purpose and Justification:** The Department of Health supported Act 268 of the 2012 Legislature
- 6 appropriating one million dollars for a new ambulance unit in Ewa Beach, Oahu. The new unit was
- 7 needed to mitigate the closure of Hawaii Medical Center West, and also to serve the growing population
- 8 of Ewa and West Oahu. A new Ewa unit was opened this past summer operating out of a temporary
- 9 location in Ewa for 16 hours a day. The need for this additional unit in West Oahu is unchanged and
- 10 therefore we recommend it become a permanent unit with appropriate funding.

I am Patricia J. Dukes, Chief of Emergency Medical Services (EMS). I testify in STRONG SUPPORT OF SB 1254 RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE.

City and County of Honolulu EMS began providing emergency medical care and ambulance services to the communities of the Ewa Plains in July 2012. Since the start of service, the Ewa Beach EMS paramedics have responded to over 1,300 9-1-1 calls for help and in a more timely fashion. Additionally, the surrounding communities of Makakilo, Kapolei, Waipahu, and Waipio benefited from the new Ewa Beach EMS operations because each community's EMS resource was available more often in the respective areas. The funding requested in SB 1254 enables the Ewa Beach EMS ambulance resource to remain in service for the communities in the Ewa Plains.
