### SB 1336, RELATING TO HEALTH CARE

Testimony of Loretta J. Fuddy, A.C.S.W., M.P.H. Director of Health

February 8, 2013

Department's Position: The Department of Health (DOH) appreciates the intent of this measure to
 amend the Hawaii Revised Statutes to designate Kahuku Medical Center as a rural hospital for the
 purposes of maintaining its critical access hospital designation. However, the Department recommends
 amending SB1336 with clarifying language to allow Kahuku Hospital to retain its Critical Access
 Hospital designation.

6 Fiscal Implications: None.

**Purpose and Justification:** The purpose of this bill is to maintain Kahuku Medical Center's critical 7 access hospital designation. The main benefit of having this federal designation for Kahuku Medical 8 Center is their ability to receive enhanced (cost-based) reimbursement from the Centers for Medicare 9 and Medicaid Services. These reimbursements ensure access to healthcare for rural communities. One of 10 11 the requirements for being a critical access hospital is that it be located in a designated rural area or that the facility be designated as a rural hospital by the State. The measure refers to Kahuku Medical Center 12 as a "rural health clinic" and a "critical access hospital". These are designations that can only be made 13 14 by the federal government. Kahuku Medical Center is currently a federally designated critical access hospital. However, it is not a federally designated rural health clinic. This function is currently being 15

- 1 fulfilled by the Koolauloa Community Health and Wellness Center. What is needed is for the State to
- 2 designate Kahuku Medical Center as a "rural hospital."
- 3 The Department of Health recommends the following amendments to clarify the terminology of

- 5 Page 1, Line 11: Strike "health clinic" and replace with "hospital"
- 6 Page 1, Lines 17-18: Strike "health clinic and approved as a critical access"
- 7 Page 1, Line 18: Strike "health clinic designation"
- 8 Page 2, Line 1: Strike "and critical access"; Strike "approval" and replace with "designation"
- 9 Page 2, Line 2: Strike "and approval"
- 10 Page 3, Report Title: Strike "Health Clinic" and replace with "Hospital"
- 11 Page 3, Description: Strike "health clinic and critical access"
- 12 The Department of Health feels these changes will clarify the intent of the bill and will allow
- 13 Kahuku Hospital to maintain its critical access hospital designation.

Testimony supporting SB 1336, RELATING TO HEALTH CARE. Designates the Kahuku medical center as a rural health clinic and critical access hospital.

Hawaii Health Systems Corporation (HHSC) strongly supports SB 1336, which will assist Kahuku Medical Center (Kahuku) in retaining its federal critical access hospital status. The federal government recently determined that Oahu does not contain any "rural areas" for purposes of critical access designation. However, the State Legislature can designate a hospital as being a rural hospital. It is our understanding that this measure is needed in order to allow Kahuku to obtain rural hospital status, which will result in Kahuku being able to retain its critical access hospital status, and thereby continue to receive better reimbursement rates in federal medical programs, such as Medicare. Kahuku, like all of the small rural hospitals, struggles financially. The legislature has subsidized Kahuku for the past several years by appropriating \$1.5 M in general fund support. Without the critical access hospital designation, Kahuku's deficits will increase.

This measure requests that Kahuku be designated a "rural health clinic and critical access hospital." We defer to the Department of Health's suggestion that the bill be

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modified to correctly designate Kahuku as a "rural hospital", instead of the language in current version of the bill.

### Supporting SB 1336: Relating to Health Care

The Healthcare Association of Hawaii advocates for its member organizations that span the entire spectrum of health care, including all acute care hospitals, as well as long term care facilities, home care agencies, and hospices. In addition to providing quality care to all of Hawaii's residents, our members contribute significantly to Hawaii's economy by employing over 40,000 people. Thank you for this opportunity to testify in support of 1336, which designates Kahuku Medical Center as a rural health clinic for the purpose of maintaining its critical access hospital (CAH) designation.

The primary benefit of the CAH program is to exempt designated facilities from the prospective payment system (PPS) because those payments are below the actual costs of care. Instead, CAH facilities receive cost-based reimbursements from Medicare and Medicaid. This enables small rural hospitals to:

- (1) Maintain primary and emergency health care services;
- (2) Offer a range of health care services that meet the needs of the community citizens; and
- (3) Remain financially viable.

CAH designation is especially critical to Kahuku Medical Center because six years ago it was planning to close due financial problems. However, it affiliated with the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation and its public hospitals. Although closure was averted, Kahuku Medical Center continues to face fiscal challenges. Furthermore, the CAH designation of Kahuku Medical Center has been recently threatened. This bill is designed to ensure that Kahuku Medical Center maintains its designation as a CAH so that it can continue to operate. This will enable the residents of Oahu's isolated North Shore community to have continued timely access to hospital care.
