The administration of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) will recommend that the OHA Board of Trustees **COMMENT** on SB231, which proposes to require the Hawai`i Tourism Authority to contract a private nonprofit to develop and maintain a comprehensive Hawaiian cultural resources inventory database.

OHA understands the value of having a central database of cultural resources to help promote the unique Native Hawaiian heritage of Hawai`i to potential visitors from around the world. Further, we acknowledge that this database would not only help visitors to experience more authentic Hawaiian cultural activities, but it would also help Native Hawaiian businesses to expand their client bases to include more visitors.

However, we have strong reservations about the bill's proposed funding mechanism for the database. SB231 would bar an unspecified general fund appropriation from being expended unless matched dollar-for-dollar by OHA. Please note that the OHA trustees are vested with exclusive authority to direct the expenditure of OHA's trust fund resources.
