# SENATE BILL NO. 2435 Proposed HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE

Chairperson Wooley and Members of the Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill 2435 Proposed HD1. This bill would establish labeling requirements within the Department of Health(DOH) for specified foods that are produced with any amount of genetic engineering. The Hawaii Department of Agriculture (HDOA) provides comments, but defers to the DOH as to the implementation of this legislation.

The United States Food and Drug Administration rigorously tests all foods that are grown for human consumption and have not found any difference between the safety of genetically engineered foods and other foods. The HDOA works closely with its federal partners and relies on their science-based conclusions to guide policy decisions.

The HDOA would like to point to the voluntary labeling of products as not containing genetically engineered material that have already begun to appear on store shelves. Mandatory labeling of a product containing a genetically engineered material would be better administered at the federal level to help to create a unified approach to this issue.

Thank you, again, for the opportunity to testify on this measure.

1 **Department's Position:** The department respectfully opposes this bill.

Fiscal Implications: Passage of this measure will require substantial resources. The department would 2 need to hire numerous experts in the field of biotechnology and genetics as well as multi-million dollar 3 analytical equipment currently not available at DOH. Additional enforcement staff will also be required. 4 **Purpose and Justification:** The department does not object in principle to a labeling policy to enhance 5 public awareness of the absence or presence of genetically engineered food or food ingredients in 6 7 Hawaii markets. However, the department is not in a position to enforce such legislation because practical and legally defensible analytical methods to detect any and all genetic modifications do not 8 9 exist. Testing for common markers could easily be evaded. Furthermore, we do not conduct genetic engineering work; and therefore, do not possess the requisite scientific expertise, capacity, equipment 10 and experience to test and determine whether a suspected food or food product has been genetically 11 engineered at a confidence that could withstand legal challenges. 12

Currently, there is no conclusive scientific evidence of negative health effects associated with the consumption of genetically engineered food or food products as determined by the U.S. Food and Drug

1	Administration. As such we do not believe such labeling is a health issue and thus do not support any
2	such program being assigned to the department to administer.
3	The department would like to focus its limited resources in areas such as controlling the
4	incidence of food borne illness risk factors by inspecting food establishments at the appropriate
5	frequency. Timely inspections have proven to produce consistent compliance with food safety
6	regulations and reduce the rates of food borne illness outbreaks.

Dear Representatives,

I strongly support SB2435\_HD1. This bill responds to and addresses all of the reservations raised by Deputy Atty. Gen. Wade Hargrove in his Memo to Senator Baker last year on HB 174 and GMO Labeling.

SB2435 maintains the proper balance between FDA regulations and allowed state labeling, respects First Amendment rights, and is now consistent with the Commerce Clause. Further, SB2435 provides a number of reasonable exemptions to the labeling requirement, and a logical distribution chain of information and realistic responsibility for the labeling. Most importantly, the effective date for this does not kick in until 3 other states have passed a similar law.

Other states have passed such a law and it is only a matter of time before states like California passes GMO Labeling. Presently, Hawaii sources most of it's food via distribution from California, so the GMO Labeling requirement should not add new cost to that distribution channel. Most importantly, other affects upon food costs such as changes to the Jones Act (ex. HCR153) have the very real potential this year to much more than offset the nominal costs of GMO Labeling.

This is a win, win, win bill, Representatives. You have nothing to fear but fear itself. Give the people of Hawaii the informed choice of knowing what they are eating, that 3 quarters of Hawaii residents have indicated they want (HNN HAWAII Poll 2/13). It's time, let's go ahead and pass SB2435\_HD1.

# **RE:** SENATE BILL 2435 SD2 PROPOSED HD1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE

Chair Wooley, Vice Chair Onishi, and Members of the Committee:

The Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii ("The Chamber") **opposes** SB 2435 SD2 Proposed HD1, which establishes labeling requirements for specified foods that are produced with any amount of genetic engineering.

The Chamber is the largest business organization in Hawaii, representing more than 1,000 businesses. Approximately 80% of our members are small businesses with less than 20 employees. As the "Voice of Business" in Hawaii, the organization works on behalf of its members, which employ more than 200,000 individuals, to improve the state's economic climate and to foster positive action on issues of common concern.

This would be another additional cost on businesses and consumers. Also the administrative burden and costs to differentiate and research food material would be great. We also have concerns that this bill may be unconstitutional and violate interstate commerce.

The Chamber understands consumer information is important. We believe that jurisdiction for these matters are generally handled by the Food and Drug Administration and are in line with generally accepted scientific principles. The American Medical Association (AMA), World Health Organization, National Academy of Sciences, and the European Union have thoroughly examined the evidence and found that consuming genetically engineered foods are no riskier than consuming conventionally grown foods. Therefore we do not support mandated labeling as there is no scientific data to prove that information would be helpful.

Just is important is the cost to business and consumers. Labeling would require companies to incur costs to not just repackage their items but also create costly tracking of their supply chain. These costs will be added onto goods and passed onto consumers. We suggest that organic products label themselves rather than mandate labeling genetically engineered products.

We respectfully ask that this bill be held in committee. Thank you for this opportunity to express our views.

The Hawaii Food Industry Association is comprised of two hundred member companies representing retailers, suppliers, producers and distributors of food and beverage related products in the State of Hawaii.

In Hawaii we already pay very high prices for food. Mandating distinctive labeling for our state, even if a couple other states join in, will force manufacturers and retailers to make up the cost of the special labels by increasing food prices, probably drastically. Alternately, some manufacturers may simply not be able to afford to continue to offer their products for sale here in our state.

The practical reality of enforcing this bill will be a nightmare. If the distributor/grower/manufacturer does not label the produce or advise the retailer that the product is GMO then the retailer is potentially liable for the mislabeling. A retailer cannot identify GMO product by visual or taste inspection.

The designation of genetically engineered as defined in this bill includes a vast range of products from papayas, to corn, to soy, and the hundreds of thousands of foods with these items as ingredients. Because of the wide variety of genetically modified foods that are available this type of label does not give consumers any real or useful information.

Foods derived from genetically engineered plants must meet the same FDA requirements, including safety requirements, as other foods, such as foods derived from traditionally bred plants. The majority of labeling requirements, such as nutrition labeling, exist to address health and nutrition concerns. Mandating special labeling for genetically engineered food could wrongly send a message to consumers that genetically modified products are not as nutritious, healthy, and/or as safe as other food.

This bill would also require that the state government engage in the technically complex, and very expensive process, of testing foods to determine the presence and content of genetically engineered material. However, the bill makes no mention of where the state will get funding for the facilities, technical staff, and training necessary to conduct these tests. It seems that the citizens of Hawaii will be asked to bear higher food prices and also some kind of tax increase to fund the process necessary to increase our food prices.

As proposed, this labeling required would be inconsistent to federal requirements, and therefore, costly to implement. Hawaii imports 85% of the food we consume in the state. However, we are still a relatively small state and even with any two other states Hawaii's food demands are not large enough to force domestic and foreign food suppliers to meet these labeling requirements. As such, the cost will be borne by Hawaii's consumers.

# This is a federal issue and should be dealt with at that level, with the onus for labeling resting with manufacturers and suppliers, not retailers.

This bill does not serve the best interest of the people of Hawaii: it is unnecessary; it will create huge added expenses for our businesses; and it will drive up the prices of food for all of us.

Chair Wooley, Vice-Chair Onishi, and Committee Members:

This is a "Gut and Replace" bill. The purpose of the bill that came over to the House from the Senate, SB2435 SD2, was "to give preference to moneys deposited into the agricultural development and food security special fund from the environmental response, energy, and food security tax for the acquisition of real property for agricultural production or processing activity." We point out that there was no hearing held on the SD2 version of this bill.

The proposed HD1 would require genetically modified food sold in Hawaii to be labeled as such starting July 1, 2015, which has nothing to do with the original bill. For this reason, **the League of Women Voters of Hawaii opposes SB 2435 SD2**, proposed HD1.

"Gut and replace" actions undermine public confidence in government because it seems something sneaky is happening in the legislative process. In order for citizens to participate actively in the legislative process, they need to be sure the process is working in a fair and transparent way.

While the material that replaces the original wording may have merit, acting in a less than open manner undermines trust. Perhaps it is time for the legislature to develop rules that allow worthwhile bills to be introduced without such a sleight of hand.

Given the negative publicity that the "gut-and-replace" tactic has received, it is disheartening and discouraging that lawmakers who should know better continue to employ it.

Since this clearly is a "gut and replace," HD1 should be rejected and any action should be on SB2435 SD2.

Chair Wooley, Vice Chair Onishi, and Members of the Committee:

I am Christopher Manfredi, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFB is comprised of 1,832 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

Hawaii Farm Bureau strongly opposes this bill for the following reasons.

While we recognize the market demand for informative and accurate food labeling, we strongly believe that food labeling should be regulated at a federal level. Because the proposed draft bill has no basis in science and does not apply equitably to all foods, the passage and implementation of this bill will result in Hawaii consumers being **less** informed than they are currently.

This past January I attended a speech given by USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack. I believe it would benefit all legislators interested in the biotechnology labeling debate to listen to that speech. The relevant segment from the transcript is below. In it, the Secretary describes a clever approach that is currently being considered by the FDA that utilizes QR codes and Smartphone technology. This is an innovative way to apply existing technology for the purpose of educating consumers, in fact, giving far more product information than is available today, without sending erroneous and confusing messages about the safety of the product.

# We oppose false, misleading, negative or deceptive labeling. We support voluntary labeling using statements that are truthful and not misleading.

There are no credible studies, much less a consensus among researchers and the medical community, that crops produced with GMO technology are unsafe. In fact the

opposite is true. Independent reviews of thousands of studies have to come to the consensus conclusion that GMO crops are safe.

Among them, The American Medical Association (AMA) concludes: "There is no scientific justification for special labeling of bioengineered foods. Bioengineered foods have been consumed for close to 20 years, and during that time, no overt consequences on human health have been reported and/or substantiated in the peer-reviewed literature."

The World Health Organization, National Academy of Sciences and The American Association for the Advancement of Science all come to similar conclusions.

Additionally, we are concerned that many food manufacturers and processors will choose not to create market-specific labels for Hawaii and will instead pull out of our relatively small market, leaving store shelves quite empty. For those that do label, their increased costs will be passed on to us, the consumers.

#### Please oppose this measure.

# USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack Monday, January 13, 2014 - San Antonio, TX

USDA SECRETARY TOM VILSACK: "We're also going to be engaged in this discussion that's taking place around the country about labeling, and I want you to know that we look at this a little differently than a lot of folks do. Our view is that people are having a 20th century debate about a 21st century problem. Folks want to assess a label that suggests that a particular product can or may contain GMO. Our concern with that is that that label may convey a different message, a message of uncertainty and potentially of unsafety. There are no studies that reflect that there is any safety concern. That's why it's probably not a good idea for us to look at labeling in that context.

On the other hand, consumers are interested in knowing more about their food, and that's a good thing. So our view is that we should be looking at ways in which we can provide those consumers who want information, the information they need, but in a way that doesn't sent the wrong set of signals. That's why we've suggested to the FDA to take a look at the possibility of creating some kind of system using a QR code. That's that funny-looking box that's got little squiggles on it. You can zap your smartphone on it, and it will give you a lot of information. That may be a way in which you can provide information but not convey a mistaken concept about the safety of the product. But we are working to make sure that we deal with this in a way that doesn't create confusion. Multiple state initiatives can often create multiple ways of addressing a problem, creating confusion in the market, and we think there is a better way to address this issue."

Because recombinant DNA technology (genetic engineering) is even more complex, and because we have almost no experience with it, it is reasonable to expect future surprises. And laboratory experiments with GE have been very limited. For some genetically engineered foods, some short-term studies have been conducted on experimental animals. But there are almost no long-term toxicological, neurological, metabolic, endocrinological, developmental or reproductive studies of these foods. Such studies are necessary to evaluate the effects of substances which are slow-acting, have cumulative or reproductive effects. Some of the harmful substances which are known to be possible in genetically engineered foods could cause allergies or toxic reactions. But, because the knowledge of DNA is incomplete, genetic engineering of food plants and animals may produce other problems which scientists have not yet anticipated. Consequently, I support Proposed HD1 which requires labeling for genetic engineered foods.

I was talking Danny Molina at the Democratic Precinct elections. He tells me that he is diversifying out of papaya, because the GMO controversy has so impacted his marketing that the profit margin is not there. Even in spite of getting permission from the Japanese government to export GMO papaya to Japan, the lack of faith in GMO products makes the market weak. Even his non-GMO Solo papaya are now suspected by the public. How would the public know which is which?

The State could have made an effort to simplify the whole controversy, by agreeing to mandate that products containing GMO's be so labeled. I think the Industry is shooting itself in the foot by fighting so hard to keep the public from knowing what products are genetically engineered. The net result is that there is a lot of fear generated, that might otherwise not be the case. We consume foods all the time that we know have been tested to have legally allowable quantities of pesticides, herbicides, drugs, etc. But the people buy them because the government says they are safe. GMO on the other hand, has seemed to have been slipped in under the radar, so to speak. That makes the public nervous, and enhances the controversy.

Not that the industry doesn't have good reason to fear. My greatest fear is that there is too little regulation in the field of bioengineering. Who approved the idea of breeding a herbicide resistant crop just so more herbicides could be used to kill weeds. Scientist already know that the net effect will be to select for resistant weeds. Thus the herbicide application will have to increase, and the health risks along with it. We learned this with insecticides. Plants mutate more slowly than insects, but they have mechanisms, other than genetic selection, to adapt. Just because a particular strategy is lucrative, does not mean that it has no long term consequences. We need to be more about studying the long term effects and less about the short term profits.

#### STRONG SUPPORT FOR SB2435\_HD1\_PROPOSED

This bill responds to and addresses all of the reservations raised by Deputy Atty. Gen. Wade Hargrove in his Memo to Senator Baker last year on HB 174 and GMO Labeling.

This bill maintains the proper balance between FDA regulations and allowed state labeling, respects First Amendment rights, and is now consistent with the Commerce Clause. Further, this bill provides a number of reasonable exemptions to the labeling requirement, and a logical distribution chain of information and realistic responsibility for the labeling. Despite common industry concerns, there's no evidence that requiring food manufacturers to label products that contain genetically engineered (GE) ingredients will increase food prices at the supermarket. According to <u>a new study</u> conducted by recognized food-marketing expert Kai Robertson, changes to a food manufacturer's product labels have not been found to affect the prices paid by shoppers.

Key findings in <u>the study</u> include the following:

Aloha, Committee on Agriculture:

PASS strongly supports SB2435 SD2 Proposed HD1. We base our stance on experience working with labor trafficked persons found on many local farms on Oahu and Kauai who are forced to spray noxious pesticides associated with GMO crop, as biotech companies devote their research to developing GMO.

"U.S. farmers are using more hazardous pesticides to fight weeds and insects due largely to heavy adoption of genetically modified crop technologies that are sparking a rise of "superweeds" and hard-to-kill insects, according to a newly released study." (Reuters, 2012)

While I support many organic local farms like Ma'o, Otsuji, and Waimanalo Country Farms, who do great and honest work in agriculture, we know for a fact that there are many *other* local farms that not only traffick people to work on their farms but also engage in unregulated and illegal handling and misuse of Restricted Use Pesticides <u>associated with GMO farming</u>. Attached is a toxicity sheet of chemicals found on local farms.

These pesticides are incredibly harmful and some of my clients have cancerous tumors, some in the nose and brain. A few have even died after spraying these chemicals, which are sometimes mixed with each other to have unknown effects (Zimmerman, 2012). None of these offenses are regulated.



GMO labeling is not merely a disclosure precaution to wary consumers. GMO labeling will allow consumers the power to affect how the market is run and how businesses treat their workers.

GMO development and the market's use of pesticides associated with GMO crop, have serious repercussions to the public health as evidenced by the suffering of PASS's clients. This must be addressed. One step in helping the public demand better accountability on the part of biotech companies, whose prime motivation is profit and not public safety, is to <u>label all GMO foods</u>. In the same way that the FDA requires ingredients to be listed on every food product sold in the U.S., we must also follow that logic and regulation with GMO products.

Currently, the federal FALCPA labeling requirements do not include raw agricultural commodities such as fruits and vegetables because never before in history have the pure substances of these commodities been altered with DNA outside of its species. This lack of adjustment to present times puts the responsibility of states to enact law to protect the public. The people have the right to know and lawmakers have the responsibility to uphold these rights over the motivations of biotech companies' bottom line.

Please pass this measure. It is a matter of serious public safety.

<u>CHOLINESTERASE INHIBITORS -</u><u>Cholinesterase</u>, or acetylcholine, produced in the liver, is one of many important enzymes needed for the proper functioning of the nervous systems of humans, other vertebrates, and insects (<u>EXTOXNET</u>). Nerve impulses are transmitted across synapses through the release of a chemical called acetylcholine. After the stimulating signals are transferred, cholinesterase is released by the body and the acetylcholine is broken down into its acetyl and choline components and removed from the synapse, allowing other signals to pass through (<u>EXTOXNET</u>). Cholinesterase inhibiting chemicals, most notably <u>organophosphate</u> and <u>carbamate Pesticides</u>, do not allow cholinesterase to end the stimulating signal which causes a build up of stimulating signals in the nervous system. Because they cannot be removed, the stimulating signals continue firing in the body which results in the uncontrollable movements that are the sign of cholinesterase inhibition including rapid muscle twitching, convulsions, and others (<u>EXTOXNET</u> and <u>PMEP</u>). 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# Pesticide use ramping up as GMO crop technology backfires: study

(Reuters) - U.S. farmers are using more hazardous pesticides to fight weeds and insects due largely to heavy adoption of genetically modified crop technologies that are sparking a rise of "superweeds" and hard-to-kill insects, according to a newly released study.

Genetically engineered crops have led to an increase in overall pesticide use, by 404 million pounds from the time they were introduced in 1996 through 2011, according to the report by Charles Benbrook, a research professor at the Center for Sustaining Agriculture and Natural Resources at Washington State University.

Of that total, herbicide use increased over the 16-year period by 527 million pounds while insecticide use decreased by 123 million pounds.

Benbrook's paper -- published in the peer-reviewed journal Environmental Sciences Europe over the weekend and announced on Monday -- undermines the value of both herbicide-tolerant crops and insect-protected crops, which were aimed at making it easier for farmers to kill weeds in their fields and protect crops from harmful pests, said Benbrook.

Herbicide-tolerant crops were the first genetically modified crops introduced to world, rolled out by Monsanto Co. in 1996, first in "Roundup Ready" soybeans and then in corn, cotton and other crops. Roundup Ready crops are engineered through transgenic modification to tolerate dousings of Monsanto's Roundup herbicide.

The crops were a hit with farmers who found they could easily kill weed populations without damaging their crops. But in recent years, more than two dozen weed species have become resistant to Roundup's chief ingredient glyphosate, causing farmers to use increasing amounts both of glyphosate and other weedkilling chemicals to try to control the so-called "superweeds."

"Resistant weeds have become a major problem for many farmers reliant on GE crops, and are now driving up the volume of herbicide needed each year by about 25 percent," Benbrook said.

Monsanto officials had no immediate comment.

"We're looking at this. Our experts haven't been able to access the supporting data as yet," said Monsanto spokesman Thomas Helscher.

Benbrook said the annual increase in the herbicides required to deal with tougher-to-control weeds on cropland planted to genetically modified crops has grown from 1.5 million pounds in 1999 to about 90 million pounds in 2011.

Similarly, the introduction of "Bt" corn and cotton crops engineered to be toxic to certain insects is triggering the rise of insects resistant to the crop toxin, according to Benbrook.

Insecticide use did drop substantially - 28 percent from 1996 to 2011 - but is now on the rise, he said.

"The relatively recent emergence and spread of insect populations resistant to the Bt toxins expressed in Bt corn and cotton has started to increase insecticide use, and will continue to do so," he said.

Herbicide-tolerant and Bt-transgenic crops now dominate U.S. agriculture, accounting for about one in every two acres of harvested cropland, and around 95 percent of soybean and cotton acres, and over 85 percent of corn acres.

"Things are getting worse, fast," said Benbrook in an interview. "In order to deal with rapidly spreading resistant weeds, farmers are being forced to expand use of older, higher-risk herbicides. To stop corn and cotton insects from developing resistance to Bt, farmers planting Bt crops are being asked to spray the insecticides that Bt corn and cotton were designed to displace."

Aloha Senators Dela Cruz, Kidani, Solomon, English, Kouchi, and Nishihara!

Today, we in Hawai`i stand on the shoulders of those who came before us. Before plantation agriculture and mono-cropping, Hawaii's people understood the significance of and need for sustainable agriculture, taking care of the land and providing healthy food to people generation after generation.

I strongly support SB 2435 that requires labeling on GMO produce and products.

This labeling requirement is reasonable:

- 1. People in Hawaii have a right to choose what we eat. Labeling requirements are already in effect for many other foods. If the GM companies and farmers are so confident in their produce, then they should inform consumers so we can make the choices for ourselves.
- Science is still "out" on the safety of GM foods. GM companies commonly conduct research on their engineering over a period of over 90 days. Longterm research raises the questions of increased tumors and early death [e.g., Serelini et al., Long term toxicity of a Round-up herbicide and a Rounduptolerant genetically modified maize, *Food and Chemical Toxicology* 50 (2012); 4221-31]
- 3. There has been a recent misconception in Hawaii's media recently that GM crops require decreased amounts of pesticides when raising GM crops has meant that the amount of pesticides used in Hawaii has increased dramatically, affecting our air, land, and through run-off our water. The American Academy of Pediatrics and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists have issued recent policy statements related to pesticides and other environmental chemicals detrimental impact on the health of pregnant women, fetuses, and young children [AAP 2013, ACOG 2013].

With nearly one-third of the countries in the world having laws and regulations mandating labeling of GM foods and food products, there remains significant questions about the impact of GM foods on health and well-being. Therefore, it is reasonable that we in Hawaii require labeling of GM foods and food products so that each and every one of us can have the right to choose the food, and the food growing practices, we believe are safe for our families and communities.

Comments: Thank you for introducing the proposed HD1, to label genetically engineered foods. I would like to make two points, equally important. First, the current predominance of genetic engineering (or genetic modification, GMOs) in US commodity crops is a phenomenon that is not market-driven. Rather, companies are allowed to sell seeds which have been modified, usually for usage with another of that company's products, such as RoundUp Ready seeds. And because of various regulatory doctrines, most notably so-called substantial equivalence, the consumer is ultimately unaware that the resulting crop was modified. So the crops being produced are not a result of consumer demand. This is an aberration in a supply and demand marketplace. A label on these types of foods should be required for those who wish to exercise a choice. For example, just because the FDA says it is safe for me to eat a fish gene in a tomato, or even Bt in corn, doesn't mean I want to. Second however, we all know that any related natural or organic crop in the path of a GMO is susceptible to cross-contamination from that GMO. The USDA has not figured out how to prevent this. But it should be no different for a consumer than for a country that does not wish to import GMOs, and can reject such crops from entrance into their country. Products that are not GMO-free should not be allowed to market as if they were. A consumer should be given the option of selecting on the basis of GMO content, from information provided conspicuously on the label of the food. I am very uncomfortable with the fact that the food I eat may be contaminated with GMOs, and from seeds produced here in the State of Hawaii. Consumers should be driving demand for products, not companies dictating supply, which I believe is a definition of fascism. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

The federal agencies rely on data produced by the companies which stand to benefit from the commercial approval of GMO crops for human consumption. Rather than proudly labeling their genetically engineered foods (now required in 62 countries,) the chemical companies producing GMOs have sought to evade labeling at every level and even now Grocery Manufacturer's Association is working at the federal level to prevent states from labeling while top GMO industry executives are holding key decision making positions in the FDA, USDA and EPA working to make sure labeling will possibly never be enacted at the federal level. This is up to the States.

"If you put a label on genetically engineered food you might as well put a skull and crossbones on it." -Norman Braksick, president of Asgrow Seed Co., a subsidiary of Monsanto, quoted in the Kansas City Star, March 7, 1994

"Monsanto should not have to vouchsafe the safety of biotech food. Our interest is in selling as much of it as possible. Assuring its safety is the FDA's job." - Phil Angell, Monsanto's director of corporate communications, quoted in the New York Times, October 25, 1998

Companies that produce genetically engineered products and foodstuff collected themselves in just a matter of months to spend over \$45 million dollars fighting GMO labeling in California's Proposition 37 alone. They can afford to label the food.

Recently major food manufacturers Pepsi, ConAgra and other funders of No to Prop 37, which consisted of biotech, GMO companies and food manufacturers who funded a campaign against food labeling transparency met with the FDA to discuss the labeling of genetically modified foods. The specific companies who funneled money to fight the public right to know if their food has GMO ingredients, have been receiving major consumer backlash. They who spent millions against food ingredient transparency are feeling the nationwide boycotts of their products and relentless exposures and viral campaigns within social media networks. It is time to address GMO food labeling.

Consumers want GMO'S LABELED. Consumers want to know, who is using GMO food. This is a reality, already in 61 countries whose legislators demonstrate deep respect for material and nutritional transparency. It is time for us to address the food industry and we are insist, with all due respect, that GMO's be labeled. A compromise, in the opinion of this organization, would be passing GMO labeling without banning GMO crops this year.

GMO's are banned at some level in at least 29 countries, and already a half dozen U.S. counties have gone GMO free. Their makers have been exiled from numerous countries and sued time and again for chemical poisoning alone. It is these products that need to be labeled, it is this you must focus on achieving. The time has come for Hawaii to eject the biotechnology seed industry and abolish the global and political GMO safe-haven that has severely derailed our sustainable future and caused Hawaii to become the foremost site

and worldwide ground zero for open air genetic experimentation. The bare minimum is GMO labeling.

Our organization was formed in response to the dire condition of our legislation and state of our agriculture and local food supply regarding GMO corporations. We advocate for citizen engagement in these issues that are coming about when many are unaware they are even up for consideration. Biotechnology corporations conducting research and production of genetically engineered organisms are, in addition to threatening our fragile ecosystem and food supply, literally exposing us to components of war chemicals, spraying it next to schools, and kupuna homes. They speak only on the brilliant aims of their science, not the failed mutations of their reality.

Class action lawsuits are starting to address heavily exposed areas and incidentally, already 52,000 sea urchins were found dead off the coast of a GMO farm in Kauai alone. These are not farming companies, these are chemical companies who seek to increase the sale of chemicals and the pestilential expansion and cross-contamination of their patented, literally now viral, genetic alterations on life.

GMO's are the most endangering and invasive species of all, there is no recuperation from GMO's, we may never be able to grow food on GMO farm land again. We do not feel GMO's should even be allowed to farm in the open air in Hawaii as they contaminate conventional crops. This is the most pressing issue in Hawaii today.

We must address GMO industry impacts on our local economy in addition to the social and environmental costs they are inducing. These companies are chemically farming an export GMO seed industry that receives obscene levels of tax relief and retains little to no benefit or profit for the state or the citizens. We desperately need local, non-toxic farming, organic and non-GMO agricultural support, not additional burdens on an industry barely surviving when GMO contamination is only a field away and pesticide drift is impacting residents and agriculture daity.

In addition to performing literally the most open air experimental field trials in the world in Hawaii, they are depleting our natural resources. Hawaii's climate is ideal for agriculture and they are able to turn 3-4 crops per year as opposed to 1-2 most places in the United States. Few other countries allow GMO companies to perform unlimited open air genetic experiments. Please pay close attention to what GMO farms are doing in Hawaii and protect the organic and non-GMO farmers by regulating GMO's and requiring they disclose their contents in food.

The once rich soil, which GMO farms are monocropping compounds similar plantation and chemical farming damages on farm lands. The same nutrients are pulled from the soil over and over, they plant no cover crops and they do not rotate crops. Instead of using cows to fertilize, and chickens to eat the pests, they use chemical fertilizers and pesticides and herbicides which saturate our soil, contaminate groundwater and kill the healthy microorganisms and bacteria that are necessary for plant life.

The companies that produce genetically engineered products are irresponsibly releasing highly controversial new life forms, of highly questionable ethics in regards to health and environmental safety. The companies manufacturing GMO's have been exiled from dozens of countries, and the damages are piling here. As public concern begins to flow and more countries ban or demand labeling, we as a society must also stand up and require the mandation of GMO labeling.

There are multiple versions of GMO's with pesticides engineered into the food, so when you consume Bt com, for example, every kernel grows its own internal pesticide. This is for sale in your grocery store. That Bt has been found in the majority of blood samples given by pregnant women and their unborn babies' umbilical blood in a study in Canada alone.

Without proper labeling, tracing the effects of GMO foods in Hawaii health is nearly impossible. Our hapai Mothers should be able to choose whether or not they want to eat food engineered to contain pesticides. All humans deserve the right to know what they are eating and what has been done to it. We are entering a new era wherein the masses want to know the source of their products, particularly their food. As new technologies and chemical farming increase, we want to follow food from the farm to the fork and know what we are supporting.

Regardless of whether or not you are unsure of just how damaging and risky biotechnology is, please hear us now. We have a right to know what we are eating, purchasing and supporting and if it has been genetically modified in addition to the 3000 ingredients, additives and processes which require labeling already. We who are conscious of GMO's will not stop until the power is back in the hands of the people over these unprincipled corporations to choose whether or not they want to eat GMO foods.

You have been given a chance to do something powerful on behalf of the people of Hawaii and stand for Hawaii and say the people have a right to know more than corporations have a right to profit off of their lack of knowledge. We do not want to spend our money on GMO's and need to be able to avoid them in order to pursue happiness and quality of life. Someone who supports them should have a choice to select GMO products, let the market speak for itself. If they one chooses to eat a GMO laden diet and does not care about serious health and environmental implications of doing so, one would still be able to under this legislation. Smokers still smoke carcinogenic formaldehyde soaked cigarettes, even with labels.

GMO corporations rely on the false principle of substantial equivalence and assure the public their foods and crops are no different than original, traditional foods while simultaneously arguing to the patent office that their inventions are unique, have never been created before, and deserve to be patented as different from all other prior existing products, successfully. If GMO foods are no different, how is it that GMO corporations are be able to patent them? That alone should raise enough concerns to warrant the mandatory labeling of these foods. Give the children of today a chance to choose tomorrow, they are not old enough yet to make it

happen by themselves and the effects of GMOs are irreversible.

Where is their research? Here is ours. The only studies representatives of GMO corporations have publicly referred to with respect, no matter how well peer reviewed, or well enough for 29 other countries to ban GMO's, are the studies funded by their own corporations and interest groups.

Ninety day studies performed by the GM companies themselves is what passes these GMO products into the food supply, when animal studies have proven it is the second and third generation effects that will be most mortal, most sterile, and most mutant, increasingly along the generation lines. GM industry funded safety research proclaiming assurances that somehow satisfy our FDA, now headed by a former Monsanto executive, are not sufficient proof of their safety. We need you to address the facts. It may be slow to absorb, but we are in dire trouble having let GMO's into Hawaii in the first place. Please fix it.

In addition we have attached a summary analysis of major studies regarding GMO labeling courtesy of Yo Kobayashi. In reality, the cost of implementing GMO labeling is nominal. Food cost fear and paranoia proffered by GE industry representatives are equivalent to propaganda grossly exaggerated by paid employees of the biotechnology industry. Analysis of the studies show the biotech funded studies greatly magnified claims of food cost increase, and that the true increase average was only 5% of their projection. The average cost per capita per annum is about \$5.

GMO producing chemical companies have shown no regard to the environment or public health concerns and should be required to label their products at the absolute, bare minimum. We and our supporters passionately encourage GMO companies to abandon their efforts in Hawaii altogether. We encourage this body to pursue with all force necessary the labeling of genetically modified foods.

Dear Chair and Committee Members:

From ancient times the Hippocratic Oath counseled physicians with the mandate: First, do no harm.

Lawmakers would be well advised to follow the same principle whenever considering actions that would impact free enterprise and the benefits that accrue to citizens through the production and exchange of goods and services.

There is no question that the imposition of regulations, such as labeling requirements for the presence of genetically modified foods that further place the burden of absorbing the penalty upon the retailer, will have an adverse effect upon businesses, the economy and ultimately upon consumers.

The real question is whether suspected harms of genetically modified organisms have been sufficiently documented to warrant the restrictions upon business being proposed by SB 2435.

The consensus of peer-reviewed science has not, however, found GMO-enhanced agriculture to be harmful to human life, and in fact has found GMO crops to be highly beneficial to humanity.

While there are many nonscientific claims of harm, and that there are many fears by those who do not accept the consensus of scientific research, it is important for lawmakers not to act hastily.

The imposition of the regulations that would be mandated by SB 2435 would result in the following harms to business and consumers:

 It raises the cost and the liability of doing business in Hawaii for our agriculture industry, threatening the growth of one of the few non-tourism sectors that is helping our economy improve. In fact, this bill may even push some smaller businesses into closing; it will certainly require them to raise their prices.

- 2. It creates a regulatory burden for Hawaii's retailers that they will find both cost-prohibitive and difficult to comply with. They too will be forced to raise prices to cover the costs associated with compliance.
- 3. The labeling scheme is likely to confuse or mislead consumers as to the safety of the products concerned. In addition, consumers will have to deal with increased food prices in a state that already has a very high cost of living.

Since there is such a strong conflict between the findings of peer-reviewed science and the claims of those who oppose the use of GMO's, the responsible course of action for lawmakers should be to call for further scientific research to clarify our understanding.

This would be a prudent step to take before imposing measures that clearly would have a harmful effect upon the economy and upon the ability of everyday citizens to live in this economy. For now, the public good is better served by government restraint.

Dear Chair Wooley, Vice Chair Onishi, and Members of the Committee:

My name is Dr. Ashley Lukens and I am the Program Director for the Hawaii Center for Food Safety (CFS). CFS is a nationwide public interest, sustainable agriculture nonprofit organization whose mission centers on furthering the public's right to know how their food is produced, through labeling and other means. We have over 400,000 farmer and consumer members across the country, including many thousands in Hawaii. CFS has worked on the issue of genetically engineered crops and GE labeling for nearly two decades, at both the federal and state levels. To that end, we have worked with dozens of states on the crafting of GE labeling bills.

I am also an adjunct professor of Political Science at UH Mānoa and UH West Oahu, where I have taught classes on food, agriculture, and policy since 2006.

I am writing in strong support of SB 2435 SB1 HD1, which requires the labeling of foods that are produced using genetically engineering.

The intention of SB 2435 SB1 HD1 is simple: it merely requires that foods that are produced using genetic engineering be labeled as such. The bill is intended to provide Hawaii consumers with information about the foods their purchase that is currently hidden.

Unlike more than sixty other countries, including the European Union member states, Japan, Brazil, Russia and China— the U.S. has no law requiring labeling of genetically engineered foods. Yet polls have repeatedly shown that the overwhelming majority of Americans—over 90% in most polls—believe GE foods should be labeled. According to a recent Star Advertiser poll 76% of Hawaii residents also support the labeling of GE foods.

Currently more than 80% of all processed foods contain genetically engineered ingredients, such as corn or soy – yet this information is not provided on the food label or made available to consumers in any way. As a consequence of our failure to label genetically engineered foods, millions of consumers are unknowingly purchasing and consuming unlabeled genetically engineered foods every day.

Labeling of GE foods is not an effort to shut down the advance of science and technology; rather, it is an effort aimed at offering the public full disclosure, preserving the right of free choice in the marketplace, and creating a better food industry. Requiring GE foods to be labeled should have no adverse impact on a company's ability to conduct new, forward thinking research. In fact, if future GE products claim to offer consumers' benefits, labeling offers these companies an opportunity to distinguish these beneficial products from other ones in the marketplace.

Of course currently none of these beneficial products exist: One of the main reasons for opposition to GE labeling is that, despite three decades of research and hundreds of millions of dollars in public and private

investment, the industry has failed to come up with even one trait that attracts consumers. This information has empowered millions of Americans to take control of what we eat and feed our families, for health, religious, environmental or ethical reasons. Since FDA has to date refused to label GE foods, it is up to individual states to lead the way—as Hawaii has in many other areas—and protect this state's interests, including its public's health, its public's right to know, its agricultural economy, its farmers and its native ecosystems.

# Testimony in Strong Support of SB2435 HD1 PROPOSED

Honorable Chair Wooley, Vice Chair Onishi and Members of the House Agriculture Committee,

My name is Mary Lacques and I am testifying in Strong Support of SB2435 HD1 PROPOSED. I am a member of Hawai'i SEED and a founding member of Label It Hawai'i. The labeling of genetically engineered food is primarily about one thing: giving consumers the freedom to choose what they are feeding themselves and their families.

Those of us testifying today in support of SB2435 HD 1 PROPOSED are in agreement with most Americans who believe we have that right. Mainstream national polls have consistently shown that over 90% of Americans support labeling of these transgenic novel products that have been in our food supply for almost 20 years. (Mellman Group February 2012 91%, MSNBC October 2011 96%).

I am sure you are aware of the February 18, 2014 Honolulu Star Advertiser front page article, Labeling for GMO Food Garners Broad Support. The poll within the article was conducted among 642 registered voters statewide by telephone from February 1-11th by Ward Research. The poll question was "Do you believe that the Legislature should pass a law requiring all GMO food sold in Hawaii to be labeled as GMO?". The response was 78% YES, 21% NO and 3% DON'T KNOW/REFUSED. I feel that the results of this poll is enough evidence to support your passage of SB2435 HD1 because you shall be upholding your mandate to represent your constituents.

You have undoubtedly heard from many concerned citizens today about the growing list of health and environmental concerns that have been attributed to the ingestion and cultivation of genetically engineered products. To date, there have been no epidemiological studies of the impacts of the consumption of genetically engineered crops on health. According to the nonprofit Center for Science in the Public Interest, over seventy percent of processed foods contain at least one ingredient derived from genetically engineered crops. The Grocery Manufacturers Association estimates that figure at eighty percent.

As you know, articles and studies on the subject of genetic engineering are published on a daily basis, and several have appeared since Monday afternoon's notice for this hearing. One in particular, from Newsweek Magazine http://www.newsweek.com/worm-now-thrives-gmo-corn-designed-kill-it-study-says-232276, describes the western corn rootworm's rapid evolution of resistance after feeding on the genetically engineered BT corn crop that was engineered specifically to kill it. "Iowa State University entomologist Aaron Gassmann and his team began to study the pests' interactions with the genetically modified organism (or GMO) corn in a lab. Their study, published Monday in the *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*, describes the western corn rootworm's rapid evolution after feeding on the engineered crop.

But Bt corn is still capable of warding off other pests, so farmers will likely keep planting it. Except now they'll need to use pesticides to protect their crop from rootworms. As entomologists warned the Environmental Protection Agency in 2012, rootworm resistance means that the environmental advantage of Bt corn—that it could be raised pesticide-free may disappear. "Unless management practices change, it's only going to get worse," Gassmann told Wired. "There needs to be a fundamental change in how the technology is used."

This one example highlights the need for our government, be it federal, state or county, to scrutinize this industrial model of agriculture, and in regard to the issue at hand today, to at least label products that contain genetically engineered ingredients.

This week a GMO labeling bill that was introduced by Vermont senator and farmer David Zukerman is in a Vermont Senate committee. Currently two states have passed a GMO labeling law, Connecticut and Maine, and these bills only kick in if other states, including a neighboring state, pass labeling requirements.

The bill that is before you today also has an Effective, or "Trigger" date in which "this part shall be effective after three states, not including Hawaii, enact a mandatory labeling law for genetically engineered foods that is consistent with the provisions of this part."

How and when this law would become effective is unknown, but please let your legacy of tenure of serving us, your constituents, show that you stood on the side of listening and responding to the voice of Hawaii's people by passing SB2435 HD1 PROPOSED.

# SB 2435 PROPOSED HD 1 RELATING TO AGRICULTURE

Requires labeling for genetic engineered foods

Chair Wooley, Vice Chair Onishi and Members of the Committee:

We are Hawaii's farmers & ranchers and floral & nursery growers who collectively produce more than 80% of the agricultural products, including food, grown in Hawaii. Additionally we are supported by community groups, agricultural support groups and key individuals and individual farmers and ranchers, large and small. Our alliance includes the commodity groups, individual farmers and ranchers, Ag land owners and support groups, and community groups listed on the attached roster.

The Hawaii Farmers And Ranchers Alliance Strongly Opposes SB 2435 Proposed HD 1.

There is no rational science-based reason to "warn" consumers about GMO products. The FDA regulates all food labeling in the United States, and in their scientific judgment, there is no significant difference between foods produced using biotechnology and their conventional counterparts. With over one trillion servings of biotech foods consumed by the public, there has never been a documented incident of any harm to the health of consumers. If we are going to mandate labeling of genetically engineered foods, we should also mandate supporting educational resources. The results of a recent survey show that the Hawaii public admits they have limited or no knowledge about this subject.

If the real reason for labeling is to provide consumers with knowledge, then the label should read: *"Contains ingredients from biotech enhanced crops approved by the USDA, FDA and EPA"* 

That would tell people what is unique about these crops. Humans have been genetically modifying crops for centuries using a variety of methods. The difference for genetically engineered crops is that they must be fully characterized and tested in order to gain approval from three different regulatory agencies – the USDA, the EPA and the FDA.

Information should be shared with the public for example, about the huge environmental advantages of how herbicide resistance traits help farmers conduct no-till farming. Eliminating the need for many insecticide spray applications is a direct result of insect resistant GMO crops. Drought tolerance and insect resistance traits reduce the risk of carcinogenic fungal contamination in the food supply. These messages have not been posted on activists' Facebook pages and we believe that the public has a "right to know" them.

Please do not give into the fear-mongers and conspiracy theorists spreading lies on social media. Hundreds of peer reviewed studies that looked for health issues associated with these foods have failed to find any. When the activists' strongest argument against the scientific opinions of the U.S. Food & Drug Administration, the National Academy of Science, and the American Medical Association is that "Monsanto paid them off," you have an idea of the level of discourse we farmers and ranchers are trying to deal with. This debate is an irrational distraction from taking care of our farms so we can feed people the most wholesome food in the world.

HFRA supports all types of farming & ranching; natural, organic, conventional and cutting edge (including GMO) and does not try to endorse one over the other. We don't see that the advancement of one, should be at the risk or detriment of the other. In fact, we believe it is detrimental for all, if one attempts to market their product by saying or implying the other is bad for consumers. We believe we need to support each other and market our own niche with sensitivity.

We also object to labeling on the basis of how expensive our food in Hawaii is going to be if 80% of it has to have an additional label. Not just for the folks who can afford this luxury, but the cost to Hawaii taxpayers who cannot afford any excess cost and the cost to feed the additional folks forced onto the welfare rolls because their food has become unaffordable.

Genetic engineering has literally saved the Papaya industry in the State of Hawaii, though some may have you believe otherwise. The legislature and the Governor has asked the farming and ranching community over and over again to tell them what we need to succeed. Let us tell you unequivocally, this will not help us OR the public. There is strong evidence that the goal of labeling is not really about what consumers would "know." It is about wanting consumers to be afraid and thus to buy more of the organic, certified non-GMO, or under-regulated supplements sold by those promoting this initiative.

Comments: Aloha My name is Aubrie Allen & I strongly support this bill. To date, there has been no long-term human safety research conducted on GMOs. To assume that they are safe defies common sense, as we lack any scientific evidence to prove that they do not pose a threat to human health. In fact, more research points towards potentially harmful effects of consuming GMOs. H.B. 6519 An Act Concerning The Labeling Of Genetically Engineered FoodThe American Academy of Environmental Medicine (AAEM)'s official position on GMOs is that they "have not been properly tested and pose a serious health risk" and that a moratorium on GMO foods should be put in place until long-term studies demonstrate their safety. Many other environmental, public health and consumer protection organizations around the world are also calling for these steps to be taken. According to the AAEM, "Animal studies indicate serious health risks associated with GM food," including reproductive problems, compromised immunity, accelerated aging, blood sugar imbalances and harm to major organs. Big Agra insists that GMO foods are perfectly safe. Yet there is undeniable scientific evidence that proves the contrary - GMOs pose a grave threat to human health. Here are examples of devastating research results: GMOs causing organ disruption: A review of 19 studies concluded that consuming GMO corn or soybeans leads to significant organ disruptions in rats and mice, particularly in livers and kidneys. The researchers who conducted the review stated that the GMO soybean and corn varieties used in the studies "constitute 83% of the commercialized GMOs" that Americans currently consume." GMOs promoting cancer and early death: Last fall, a French research team published a study in a peer-reviewed journal showing that rats exposed to low doses of both GMO corn and the widely used herbicide Roundup developed horrifying mammary tumors and widespread organ damage. The researchers said that 50% of males and 70% of females died prematurely, compared with only 30% and 20% in the control group. Insecticide chemicals ending up in our blood: A study published in Reproductive Toxicology detected a GMO insecticide chemical, known as Bt toxin, in human blood, offering proof that its widespread use is a major public health concern. Upon taking blood samples, researchers detected the Bt toxin in a shocking 93% of pregnant women, 80% of fetuses and 69% of non-pregnant women. The fact that Bt toxin was detected even in unborn babies shows that the chemical persists far longer than the biotechnology industry claims it does. GMOs altering digestive tracts: A shocking study showed that genetically modified plant DNA leads to the development of "GMO" microorganisms, which reproduce continuously inside the human body. These microorganisms actually become part of the bacteria in our digestive tracts and reproduce continuously inside us - even after we stop eating GMO foods. No one knows what the implications of having genetically engineered genes permanently living inside our guts may be. GMOs may

contribute to obesity: Research from Norway suggests that eating GMO corn and corn-based products, as well as meat from animals that are fed GMO grain, will cause you to weight gain faster and retain the weight. The study also linked GMO consumption to significant changes in the intestinal tract, kidney and liver, as well as pancreas, genitals and the immune system. These studies are certainly cause for immediate concern. GMOs threaten traditional farming. Aside from the potential dangers of consuming GMO foods, GMOs pose a grave threat to the entire organic farming industry. (Scientists say that cross-contamination of GMO crops with non- GMO crops will be inevitable.) GMOs also contribute to greater pollution because many are designed to withstand greater application of pesticides and herbicides. Experts all over the world are warning that as more and more GMOs are approved, they could become so intertwined with our food supply that we reach a point of no return. Ask yourself: If the USDA and the Big Agra companies are so sure that GMOs are completely safe, why do they vigorously lobby against any efforts to label foods containing GMOs? And to do the research? Clearly, if their GMOs were so amazing for solving food problems, wouldn't they want to flaunt it, rather than hide it? I think they surely would, unless they have something to hide, and are concerned about liability. We all have the right to choose, educated on this matter or not.
