TO THE HONORABLE KARL RHOADS, CHAIR, AND TO THE HONORABLE SHARON E. HAR, VICE CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department") appreciates the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill No. 2475, Relating to Assisting Unlicensed Contractors. My name is Daria Loy-Goto, Complaints and Enforcement Officer of the Department's Regulated Industries Complaints Office ("RICO"). RICO offers the following testimony in support of the bill.

Senate Bill No. 2475 amends §444-9.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") to provide that a contractor licensee who aids and abets an unlicensed contractor may be subject to further discipline by the Contractors License Board ("Board").

Senate Bill No. 2475 will enable RICO to pursue, and authorize the Board to take, disciplinary action against contractor licensees who aid and abet unlicensed contractors. We believe the bill will not only enhance enforcement efforts, but also serves an important consumer protection function by dissuading licensed contractors from recommending unlicensed contractors to unwitting consumers.

SUBJECT: S.B. 2475, Relating to Assisting Unlicensed Contractors

Dear Chair Rhoads, Vice-Chair Har, and members of the Committee;

My name is Gladys Marrone, Government Relations Director for the Building Industry Association of Hawaii (BIA-Hawaii), the Voice of the Construction Industry. We promote our members through advocacy and education, and provide community outreach programs to enhance the quality of life for the people of Hawaii. BIA-Hawaii is a not-for-profit professional trade organization chartered in 1955, and affiliated with the National Association of Home Builders.

BIA-Hawaii **supports** S.B. 2475, which seeks to clarify that a contractor licensee who aids and abets an unlicensed contractor may be subject to additional discipline by the Contractors License Board (CLB).

Unlicensed contractors do not play by rules that licensed contractors play by. They are a menace to the State, by not being bonded or insured, and to homeowners, who would be liable for any injuries sustained on the job by the unlicensed contractor. That being said, however, should a licensed contractor aid and abet an unlicensed contractor, we agree that that licensed contractor should also be subject to discipline.
