Chair Luke, Vice-Chair Nishimoto, Vice-Chair Johanson, and Members of the Committee:

Good afternoon. I am GG Weisenfeld, Director of the Executive Office on Early Learning (EOEL). EOEL is in support of Senate Bill 2768, House Draft 1.

The purpose of this bill is to make kindergarten mandatory for a child who will be at least five years of age on or before July 31 of the school year. The bill further requires the Department of Education, in collaboration with the Executive Office on Early Learning, to develop a statewide individualized kindergarten readiness system and establish an individualized kindergarten readiness assessment system.

EOEL supports the provision to make kindergarten mandatory.

Across the nation, most school districts require that a child be five years old before entering kindergarten or become five in the first month of school. In 2012, 39 states and the District of Columbia had cutoff dates of September (usually the first day of school) or earlier.

As we work to implement an early learning system in Hawaii, it makes sense to have mandatory kindergarten to promote the continuity of children's experiences from prekindergarten to kindergarten. While most children enroll in kindergarten, some families do not feel compelled to send their children to school on a consistent basis because it is not mandatory. Without the skills that can be gained through a kindergarten experience, these children may have to play

catch up with their peers in first grade. This may leave the child feeling discouraged and put them in a position to fall further behind.

With the adoption of the Common Core State Standards for kindergarten to grade 12, it is even more important now that kindergarten be made mandatory so Hawaii's children can meet the academic requirements of K-12.

EOEL also supports the requirement of this bill that EOEL cooperate with the Department of Education to develop a statewide individualized kindergarten readiness system. As EOEL develops a prekindergarten program for four-year-olds, it is important that the School Readiness and Early Childhood Education programs align with the DOE kindergarten program. A kindergarten readiness assessment system is an important part of achieving this alignment.

**PURPOSE:** The purposes of this bill are to make kindergarten mandatory for a child who will be at least five years of age on July 31 of the school year; requires the Department of Education, in collaboration with the Executive Office on Early Learning, to develop a statewide kindergarten readiness program; establishes an individualized kindergarten readiness assessment; and makes an appropriation to the Department of Education.

**DEPARTMENT'S POSITION:** The Department of Human Services (DHS) supports the intent of this bill and defers to the Department of Education and the Executive Office on Early Learning on the implementation of its provisions.

Act 169, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, established the existing child care assistance program, called Preschool Open Doors, as the statewide school readiness program to be administered by the Department of Human Services. The Preschool Open Doors (POD) program serves low- to moderate-income families whose late-born children are affected by the change in kindergarten entry age in the 2014-2015 school year or whose children will be eligible for kindergarten in the following school year.

Requiring that kindergarten attendance be mandatory under the compulsory education law would require children enrolled in the POD program to attend kindergarten in the following year and will promote continuity of the children's early learning experiences and thus maximizing the value of the POD program. Children will have the needed school-readiness skills they experienced in a preschool setting through the POD program and will be ready to apply those skills in kindergarten.

The Honorable Chair Sylvia Luke and Members of the Committee:

## The Hawaii State Teachers Association (HSTA) wholeheartedly supports S.B. 2768, SD2, HD1 relating to Kindergarten, and offers amendments to the bill.

HSTA is the exclusive representative of more than 13,500 public and charter schoolteachers statewide. As the state affiliate of the 3.2 million members of the National Education Association, HSTA believes that kindergarten should be mandatory and adequate funding should be provided by the state to make kindergarten available to all five year olds.

Kindergarten is an essential part of early childhood education, providing key introductions to reading, writing, mathematics, science, and peer socialization. While President Obama's State Of The Union Address referred to the proliferation of prekindergarten programs throughout the United States, studies show that pre-kindergarten programs are most effective when coupled with guality kindergarten education, which serves as an important transitional function in teaching basic academic and social skills that prepare children for lifelong learning. The National Center for Education Statistics states that over the course of a single year, kindergarten students can improve reading and math scores by 10 and 8 percentile points, respectively. Kindergarten offers longterm benefits to society as well, including crime reduction, decreased healthcare costs, and improved job growth. Between promoting academic success and advancing socioeconomic prosperity, kindergarten effectively defines success for future generations.

In Hawaii, approximately 97 percent of children currently eligible to attend kindergarten do so. The remaining 3 percent amounts to 500-600 students, however, a population size nearly as large as the target group covered by the governor's proposal to use vacant public school space to to provide early childhood instruction to at-risk youth. If providing quality early childhood instruction is a state goal, we feel that it is incumbent upon policymakers to ensure that all students are afforded the opportunity to maximize

Since not all children attend preschool, maximizing early childhood education can only be achieved by instituting a mandatory kindergarten program that covers all students under the certified professionals of our state's public schools. Notably, implementing a mandatory kindergarten program will also help schools struggling to find new positions for early childhood education teachers whose jobs are in danger of being cut because of the repeal of junior kindergarten.

That said, we encourage you to amend page 1, line 6 of the bill to read: "...least [six] five years on or before December 31 of the school year," which will implement a program that encapsulates all children in need of early childhood education alternatives, including the estimated 7,000 late-born "gap" children who won't be 5-years-old by the first day if school this year. While the governor has proposed a public-private partnership to expand preschool opportunities in the islands, we feel that this proposal represents a voucher program in which public funds will be used to subsidize private education. Expenditures made for the governor's program would likely be nontransparent, as the state has faced difficulty in tracking public funds currently used to support students with special needs who are placed in private school settings. Moreover, the governor's program, explicitly relies on faith-based preschools, blurring the line separating church and state and running afoul of the Constitution's Establishment Clause. Implementing a mandatory kindergarten program with a December deadline faces none of these problems, erases the state's crisis over early childhood education offerings, and most importantly keeps early learning in the hands of highly qualified and certified public school teachers.

HSTA supports full day mandatory Kindergarten programs. If early childhood education is a priority, then schools should have mandatory kindergarten in our compulsory attendance laws before a new project is started.

SB 2768, SD2, HD1: Relating to Kindergarten.

Chair Luke, Vice Chairs Nishimoto and Johanson, and Members of the Committee: SB 2768, SD2, HD1 makes kindergarten mandatory. It develops a statewide individualized kindergarten readiness system and establishes an individualized kindergarten readiness assessment system, effective July 1, 2014.

Hawaii P-20 strongly supports this bill. As an organization that works in partnership with the Executive Office on Early Learning, the Hawaii Department of Education and the University of Hawaii, Hawaii P-20 works to improve the educational pipeline and facilitates seamless educational experiences across systems. Full-day kindergarten is essential to create the educational, socio-emotional and physical building blocks to success in latter years in the K-12 education system and beyond.

In particular, Hawaii P-20 strongly supports the creation of an appropriate individualized kindergarten readiness assessment system. Currently, schools create or adopt their own assessments in order to survey incoming students' readiness for school. Many of these tools are not developmentally appropriate, cumbersome to administer, and expensive. Moreover, they do not provide any uniform data to the Hawaii Department of Education about children's readiness or consistent feedback to early learning programs about their preparation of children or feedback to parents and families about their child's learning and development. It is absolutely essential that the state begin to collect data about individual child readiness for kindergarten in order to improve the preparedness of children, aid teachers in providing differentiated learning techniques, and for longitudinal studies about education outcomes. At Hawaii P-20, we have witnessed the incredible gains made by teachers and their students in our pilot programs instituting an individualized assessment of kindergarten children.

Furthermore, we strongly support the request for the funding of an appropriate assessment tool, as well as the ongoing training necessary on the chosen tool. The Hawaii Department of Education cannot be expected to implement a new statewide assessment system without adequate funding. Thank you for this opportunity to testify.

This testimony is submitted in support for SB2768 SD2 HD1, requiring Kindergarten to be mandatory, and establishing a statewide Kindergarten readiness and assessment system.

The Hui for Excellence in Education (HE'E) is a diverse coalition of over 40 parent and community organizations dedicated to improving student achievement by increasing family and community engagement and partnerships in our schools. Our member list is attached.

The Coalition supports mandatory Kindergarten for our students. The Coalition in recent years has supported Early Learning legislation, as our members believe that the earlier a child is exposed to school, the better outcomes for student achievement. Page 3 Section 3 (a) The department shall establish and maintain kindergartens with a program of instruction IN EITHER OF HAWAI'I'S OFFICIAL LANGUAGES as part of the public school system

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It is important to clarify that mandatory kindergarten includes two official language mediums of instruction. It is also important to recognize that standards and assessments are aligned to the medium of instruction.

The 'Aha Pūnana Leo, a non-profit Native Hawaiian educational organization established in 1983 due in great part to our family engagement component, is the only statewide Hawaiian medium early learning preschool system. With 11 full-day and year-round center-based sites on Hawai'i, Maui, Moloka'i, O'ahu and Kaua'i, our mission to revitalize the Hawaiian language through high quality preschool experiences will be greatly and positively impacted with the passing of this bill.

My name is Nāko'olani Warrington. I am a retired State of Hawai'i Department of Education elementary school teacher. During my tenure as a DOE teacher, I taught in both Hawaiian medium and English medium schools. I have also been a teacher at private and public preschools delivering instruction in both of Hawai'i's official languages, a resource teacher in English medium schools, a substitute teacher for public and private K-12 schools in both Hawaiian and English and a program assistant at a nonprofit Hawaiian language preschool organization. I am grateful for the many wonderful opportunities I have had to teach Hawai'i's amazing children in Hawai'i's two distinct pathways of learning through Hawai'i's two official languages.

Mahalo for the opportunity to provide the following comments with regard to SB2768.

The purpose of SB2768, as stated in the measure, is to "improve early childhood education in Hawaii." However, nowhere in this bill are there any provisions for, or acknowledgements of, Hawai'i having **TWO OFFICIAL LANGUAGES WITH TWO PATHWAYS OF LEARNING**. I speak from experience when I testify that education in Hawai'i will only truly improve once there is equity for learning in **BOTH OF HAWAI'I'S OFFICIAL LANGUAGES**. A significant group of children being educated through the medium of the indigenous language of Hawai'i are not being equitably considered in SB2768 and, in fact, may be harmed unless <u>amendments are</u> **made to SB2768**, specifically adding the underlined:

Page 3 Section 3 (a) The department shall establish and maintain kindergartens with a program of instruction IN EITHER OF HAWAI'I'S TWO OFFICIAL LANGUAGES as part of the public school system.

Page 8 Section 6 (b) (3) Align with Hawai'i early learning and development standards **APPROPRIATE FOR EITHER OF HAWAI'I'S TWO OFFICIAL LANGUAGES.**
In February of this year, Hawaiian medium students and their families were thrilled when the State of Hawai'i's Board of Education reaffirmed and strengthened its commitment to Hawaiian Medium Education, **kindergarten** through grade 12, in public schools. The BOE's newly adopted 2014 policy states, "*Hawaii's public education system should embody Hawaiian values, language, culture and history as a foundation to prepare students in grades K-12 for success in college, career and communities, locally and globally.*" **SB2768 must be amended** to reflect this same commitment as this bill directly affects the same Hawaiian Medium Education students as the BOE policy.

In closing, the Hawaiian Medium Education system and the support it provides for both students and their families, from preschool through the doctoral level, has proven time and again to be an environment that develops excellent individuals who are successful, respectful and driven to serve their communities.

I am testifying in opposition to SB2768. While I am not against early mandatory education our current system may have children beginning curriculum that they are not prepared for. Under our current system and based on the intent of this bill children would be required to attend kindergarten at age 5. Unfortunately this age based criteria for beginning primary school is part of our problematic one size fit all education system. The reality is that people mature at different rates and assigning students to grades based on their age will put some students in a situation where they are learning things they may not be prepared for yet.

Kindergarten begins the emphasis on "formal learning" over socialization and play. Some children may not be ready to begin formal education and so would more properly belong in preschool.

Part of what drives our current society to want to be able to start children in public education at an early age has to do with economic realities, it is very common for a family to require income from both parents and so the age at which a child may begin public education coincides with the time when a parent may be able to return to the workforce. There is also an idea that sooner is better, but individual children vary and should not be required to begin primary school until they are developmentally ready. Mandatory schooling for 5 year olds should not be implemented until the State is prepared to provide public preschool for all students who may not be developmentally ready to begin kindergarten with the greatest results.

For these reasons I ask that this committee please consider deferring this bill at the current time.
