TESTIMONY ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2272, RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS FOR REAL ESTATE APPRAISERS.

TO THE HONORABLE ANGUS L.K. MCKELVEY, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Alan Taniguchi, Executive Officer for the Real Estate Appraiser Program, Professional and Vocational Licensing Division ("PVLD") of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Department"). Thank you for the opportunity to present testimony on House Bill No. 2272, Relating to Criminal History Record Checks for Real Estate Appraisers.

The Department strongly supports this administration bill. This bill seeks to amend the law relating to criminal history record checks to allow the Department to conduct criminal background checks on real estate appraiser license applicants as required by federal law.

Under the provisions of Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery and Enforcement Act of 1989, the Appraiser Qualifications Board "AQB" establishes the minimum education, experience, and examination requirements for real property appraisers to obtain a state license or certification. Effective January 1, 2015, all candidates for a real property appraiser credential must undergo background screening. State appraiser regulatory agencies shall, at a minimum, obtain fingerprints of the individual and any appropriate identifying information for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation and/or any governmental agency or entity authorized to receive such information in connection with a state and national background check.

Real estate appraisers are licensed by the Department in accordance with standards set forth by the Appraiser Qualifications Board ("Board"), under Title XI of the Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery and Enforcement Act of 1989. As of January 1, 2015, the Board will require a criminal background check for all real estate appraiser license applicants. House Bill No. 2272 authorizes the Department to conduct criminal background checks on applicants for real estate appraiser licenses. House Bill No. 2272 is necessary to ensure that the Department's Real Estate Appraiser Program remains in compliance with federal law.
