In consideration of **SENATE BILL 2874** RELATING TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES

Senate Bill 2874 proposes to amend the composition of the Board of Land and Natural Resources by requiring that at least one member shall have a background in native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) strongly supports this Administrative bill.

Currently, nearly all of the boards and commissions under the Department require a member with a background in native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices. Last session, legislation was enacted requiring such expertise for the Natural Area Reserves System Commission. The remaining Department boards and commissions that need such expertise are the Board of Land and Natural Resources and the Endangered Species Recovery Committee.

As the Department is obligated under the Hawaii Constitution and Hawaii statutory and case law to preserve and protect the exercise of traditional and customary native Hawaiian rights, it would provide great value to have a member on the Board of Land and Natural Resources to have expertise in this area to provide guidance on natural resource protection and management decisions.

The Hawaiian Affairs Caucus of the Democratic Party of Hawaii supports SB2874 that would require that at least one member of the Board of Land and Natural Resources (BLNR) have a background in native Hawaiian traditional and customary practices.
